The Cove Center for Grieving Children, a non-profit grief and healing organization dedicated to helping children and families who have experienced the death of a loved one, has partnered with The Moyer Foundation to facilitate Camp Erin Connecticut.

Camp Erin® is a FREE, weekend long grief support camp to be held on **June 1-3, 2018** that is designed to help children and teenagers aged 6-17, who have experienced the death of a parent, sibling or someone close to them.

**Camp Erin Connecticut is open to all grieving children statewide.**

Camp Erin combines traditional, fun camp activities with grief education and emotional support, facilitated by grief professionals and trained volunteers. Through interactions with other children and with adults, campers learn that they are not alone in their grief. Camp Erin provides a relaxed, safe and supportive setting for children to express emotions, share their grief and learn positive coping skills.

The Cove Center for Grieving Children will also provide families with long-term support at our family sites.

The Moyer Foundation is a public, 501 (c)(3) organization founded in 2000 by World Series champion pitcher Jamie Moyer and his wife Karen. The Foundation's mission is to empower children in distress and give children the tools and skills to overcome life's greatest challenges. Camp Erin is The Moyer Foundation's furthest reaching initiative and the largest network of free bereavement camps in the country specifically designed for grieving children and teens between
