NSGA’s Media department works alongside its field staff to write, direct, and films skits on issues like teenage pregnancy, HIV/AIDS, malaria, and water and sanitation in the local languages, and exhibits them during community film shows. As we continue to grow as an organization, NSGA is looking to build its in-house video production and editing capacities such that it can produce higher quality films for both internal and external use. Additionally, we are looking to increase our social media presence and expand our audience through online outreach.
