The mandate of CCA is to bring transformational knowledge to our communities through strong and vibrant partnerships.</p> <p>The Atlantic Council for International Cooperation's member and Canadian partner organization for the internship is Chalice. Chalice is a Catholic charity that primarily supports community initiatives in developing countries through the sponsorship of children and elderly in need. We began our mission in 1996 as Christian Child Care International, an independent Canadian sponsorship organization. Our name changed to Chalice in January 2008. Chalice has 57 Sponsor Sites in 15 countries around the world. Children are sponsored in Bangladesh, Bolivia, Cameroon, Chile, Ghana, Guatemala, Haiti, India, Kenya, Paraguay, Peru, Philippines, Tanzania, Ukraine and Zambia.</p> <p>Chalice works in partnership with CCA and Saidia site in Gilgil, Kenya. They enjoy a close working relationship that has allowed them to develop and deliver a wide range of programs jointly. Parents and Guardians of sponsored children are engaged as well by attending regular meetings and workshop. The Site is working towards better opportunities for further empowerment and economic development of community groups..</p>
