In the 1800s, Baltimore was one of the busiest ports in the U.S. More importantly to designers, the Linotype was developed here in 1884. The creation of a typesetting machine, in place of setting type by hand, revolutionized the printing industry. We'll have a special one-hour tour of the Museum of Industry's printing facilities, including a demonstration by former newspaper typographers of a real working Linotype—setting hot lead type before your very eyes!—as well as a demonstration of letterpress printing.

In addition, you can tour the entire Museum and learn about the roles played by Baltimoreans of every background in our city's first industries. See a replica of an early dock and walk through the original 1865 Platt Oyster Cannery. Take a peek behind the scenes of filming *The Wire*, experience live blacksmithing, learn all about our early brewing industry...
