This talk will present images of Cuba's capital, Havana, taken during the week of US President Obama's recent historic visit. With special attention to the urban design of Havana, these images reflect the city's regional Modernism and Modernism's reciprocal relationship with the city's form. The pictures also document the importance of public art in contemporary Cuba and its visual prominence against the backdrop of Havana's multiple-layered (and often decaying) material culture. Yet, despite its emphasis on architecture and art, this presentation will confirm that the vitality of its inhabitants remains at the core of understanding Havana's past, present, and future urban development.
