#### Who should attend?

#### Are there any options?

There are several, including:

If focusing on taking risks and facilitating controversial discussions, this workshop can be delivered as a 65min or a **90min workshop, repeated in a day**

If the workshop also includes practical implications for promoting British values, then this workshop can be delivered as **2 hour** or a **half-day workshop**, as a single event or repeated in a day.

It can become a **one-day workshop** by combining with another workshop such as understanding the impact of unconscious bias on teaching and learning.
