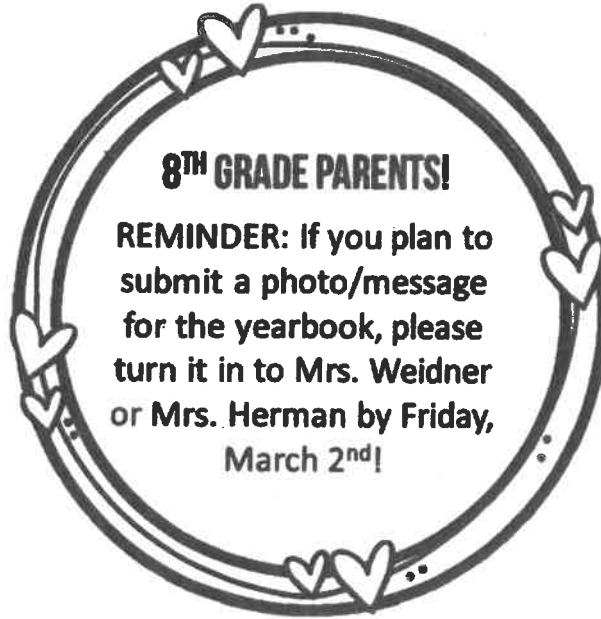

STUDENT VOLUNTEER TRAINING

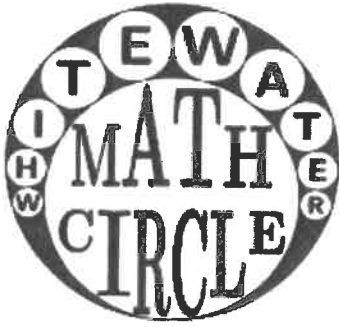
5th-8th grade students are asked to attend a brief volunteer training after lunch to learn new shift times and job duties.

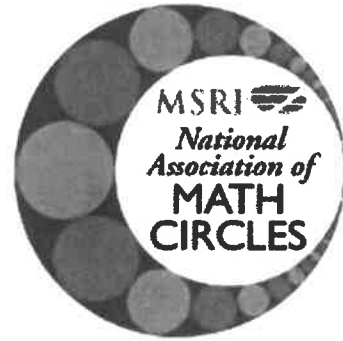
