## FROM THE DESK OF FR. MIKE

Last week I shared Part 1 of a two part article for the parishioners and the faithful of St. Mary's. Today I share Part 2 of my article of written reflections from the book, **Connecting the Pulpit and Pew: Breaking Open the Conversation About Catholic Preaching**, by Karla J. Bellinger. She writes of her research on the topics of the "new evangelization" and preaching as a means to deepening ones faith.

When presenting questions for personal evaluation of a pew-sitter she listed seven series of questions:

1. On a scale of 1 – 10, how much do you prepare for Sunday Mass? In prayer? By reading the Scriptures? By fasting for an hour? By dressing for the occasion? By getting family members there? By setting aside distractions?
2. What is on your mind as you slide into the pew at Mass? How long does it take for you to get focused on the Mystery who is God?
3. When you are listening to a homily, what are you listening for? Look at factors of your own receptivity: What attitude do you bring to that homily? Does your receptivity depend on who is preaching? What hard feeling might you need to overcome to hear God speaking in the homiletic message? At what point do you stop listening? What captures your attention?
4. When you walk out of Mass, how did your encounter with God (Or lack thereof) change that way that you behave in the rest of your life?
5. When your friends, family, colleagues think of people of deep faith and holiness, are you likely to be among the top ten that come to their minds?
6. What image of faith springs up when your people hear your name? Are you known mostly for some thing else? Where do you find your identity, how does that relate to God?
7. Do you have a reputation for treating people with caring, kindness, and love? What memories of "Christian" and "Catholic" do you give to folks in the "Non-churchy" world?

The Church teaches that the Sunday Eucharist is to be the source and summit of our lives as Catholics. May we commit to more fully participating in the full celebration of the Mass, being mindful of how we contribute to the public prayer at St. Mary's and how our participation in the songs, prayers and liturgy impact and deepen the experience of all who come to participate in the Mass.

## Mondays for Mental Health

### *Fourth in a series of what our Faith Community can do to support those with mental illness and their families.*

People with mental illness and their families may feel isolated from their faith community and thus isolated from God. If someone feels rejected by Church they feel rejected by God. Isolation is often caused by the stigma associated with having a mental illness. The fear of being judged as inadequate or weak willed, or the misperception that God is punishing them because they did something wrong, or the communities misperception of what mental illness is and how it affects the individual and their families are powerful contributors to the isolation and loneliness that people feel. As a healing community we can support people with mental illness and their families with unconditional non-judgmental love in the following ways: increase our awareness of mental illness and where to get help; offer prayers and support for individuals and families who are affected by mental illness; serve on parish committees for outreach to individuals and families, get involved in peer to peer ministry; and work on the justice issues affecting mental health care.

## Readings for the Thirtieth Week in Ordinary Time

**Monday, October 29, 2018**

**Eph 4:32—5:8; Lk 13:10-17**

*Be kind to one another.* Today's passage from the letter to the Ephesians reads like a series of grandma's samplers — Mom wisdom that could be summed up, "Just get along for goodness sake!" Living with two boys and their pile of Lego blocks is a homely illustration of why world peace isn't yet. ("Be kind to one another.") The incessant cry of, "That's mine!" ("Greed must not even be mentioned among you.") And when they are getting along and don't know I'm listening. ("No obscenity or silly or suggestive talk") Thank goodness it's more silly than suggestive at this point. Applying the lessons of Scripture to family life is challenging. On the other hand, what better lessons are there? *Jesus, Savior and Brother, help us live as children of the light.*

**Tuesday, October 30, 2018**

**Eph 5:21-33; Lk 13:18-21**

*What is the kingdom of God like?* Today's first reading is what I call a "nudger." Read a few lines and watch husbands playfully nudge their wives. Read a few more lines and watch the wives nudge back. It's a tricky reading and if you will, please allow me to offer a bit of advice to the preacher: Unless you are willing to do your homework, please don't go there. You could do more harm than good. Moving on to the Gospel, so what is the kingdom like? Small, unassuming beginnings that flourish into what none could have imagined. And note that good old Luke does his parallel thing with an example of a man planting a seed and a woman leavening her bread. How lovely. We don't know when just a little effort at the right time in the right place will yield abundant blessings. *Ever-living God, give us the grace of mature faith, enlightened by scholarship, inspired by the saints of all times and places.*

**Wednesday, October 31, 2018**

**Eph 6:1-9; Lk 13:22-30**

*I do not know where you are from.* Over the years our children have worn all sorts of Halloween masks. A parent's prayer is that, at the end of the day, they will take them off. You see,

none of us is an angel or a devil; a super hero or one of the walking dead; perfect beyond needing help or flawed beyond the help helping. We are put on this Earth to discover our true face and that true face reveals something of the divine. When that true face remains masked by pain, addiction, desperation, fear, disappointment, unreasonable expectations, then that one and only beautiful face may never be discovered. And this is a tragedy, first because the world is poorer if that unique face of the divine is never revealed. And also because, when we finally meet our God, we may hear, "You aren't the person I created you to be ... I don't know you." *Creator God, we pray, strip us of all that is not of you.*

**Thursday, November 1, 2018**

**Rv 7:2-4, 9-14; 1 Jn 3:1-3; Mt 5:1-12a**

**All Saints**

*I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue.* John's vision, as described in the Book of Revelation, reminds me of Flannery O'Connor's short story, "Revelation." Mrs. Turpin, who prides herself on her own propriety, has an unwelcome vision of all the folks she has deemed less than herself heading toward heaven, and not in the stately manner she imagines such an entrance deserves, but "shouting and clapping and leaping like frogs." Amazing how we think we are so different from others. And yet if one compares that imagined difference to the difference between me and God ... well then, no human is all that different from another. Not a bad thing to remember as we gaze around at our fellow saints. We may as well get used to each other — hopefully we will have eternity together. *Holy God, I want to say, "Make me a saint," but that's a bit scary; so instead I pray, "please make me want to be a saint."*

**Friday, November 2, 2018**

**Wis 3:1-9; Rom 5:5-11 or Rom 6:3-9; Mt 25:31-46**

**All Souls**

*What you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.* In

a talk I heard more than a decade ago, John Carr, then executive director for the U.S. Bishops' Office of Justice, Peace, and Human Development, said that Matthew 25 is the only place in the Gospels where we are told what we need to do to get to heaven. His assertion stuck with me. Even if it is exaggerated a bit, one can't deny that Jesus seems very clear about this message. Jesus identifies with those who are in need and judges those who could meet the need. Perhaps there were implied exclusions, but I honestly can't find them. Nothing about the needy being one of our own or worthy or "legal." It is something to think about on this All Souls Day. What life will bring us a sense of satisfaction as we prepare to cross the great divide? *Generous God, show me the way to be a person for others.*

**Saturday, November 3, 2018**

**Phil 1:18b-26; Lk 14:1, 7-11**

*For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.* In the last two years, I have been blest to travel: Costa Rica, Florida, India, Jordan, Rome, Alaska. There are things that make for a good journey, whether to another place or that universal journey through life. The first is obviously preparation — one needs documents, reservations and arrangements made for those at home. Unfortunately, those who are best at preparation may not have another necessary mindset to make the difference between a terrible time and a great one — flexibility. Things happen: changes in weather, canceled flights, miscommunications. Traveling light is necessary. Perhaps as important as any is the sense of wonder. I try to remember that I'm sitting in a chair and flying! Finally, it helps to decide it's okay if others are first or get the best seats or whatever. When I can manage this attitude, I see fellow travelers as something more than competition — maybe even the person who will make the journey all the more delightful. *God of all peoples in all places, give me the grace to be mindful of others and welcome all you place on my path.*

### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

Father Mark Augustine spoke to all parish 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Confirmation candidates, their sponsors, and parents this month. He explained what Confirmation is, why sacred Chrism is used as well as the role of parents and sponsors. Fr. Mark emphasized that we make a choice to be Catholic, we are called to be witnesses of the Faith, and we are called to show Christ's love in how we act, love, and serve.

This meeting was the first formal event guiding 8<sup>th</sup> grade Confirmation candidates to prepare to receive the Holy Spirit in the sacrament. 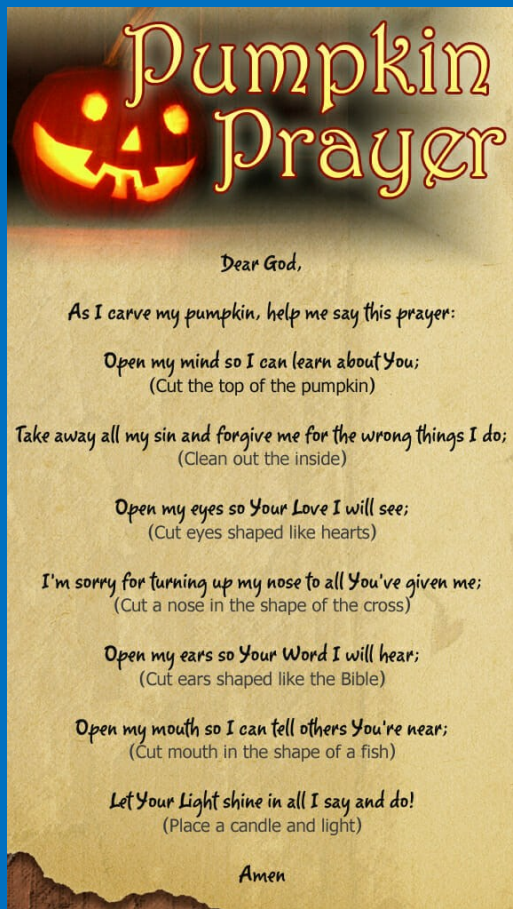

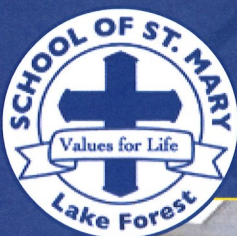

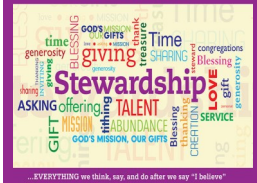
