EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:

RCF/E-JIF/MEL MEETINGS – Mr. Sacco informed the Board that the Residual Claims Fund, the E-JIF, and the MEL all met on June 7, 2018 at the Forsgate in Jamesburg. He then referred to Commissioner Laureigh's reports on the meetings.

RCF CLAIMS TRANSFER - Mr. Sacco reported that the RCF Board voted to accept a recommendation to transfer open liabilities from local JIFs at 60 months instead of 54 months, which will allow claims to develop longer and provide greater certainty on reserves. He added that the RCF will take formal action confirming this transfer at their next meeting and noted local JIFs will be asked to pass a resolution transferring their Fund Year 2014 liabilities at their September/October meetings.

LEGISLATIVE ALERT – Mr. Sacco reported that during the month of June, the Fund Office distributed a Legislative Alert on three bills pending action, that will cause major increases in municipal insurance costs. He noted that members were asked to adopt resolutions in support of amendments to those bills as all 3 bills will impact the cost of workers' compensation. He then referred to a copy of the Alert along with Resolution #19-18 for the Ocean JIF to adopt.

POLICE ACCREDITATION GRANT PROGRAM – Mr. Sacco indicated that South Toms River Borough has recently requested approval for a police accreditation grant to have the police department accredited. He noted that all the necessary paperwork has been submitted and is in order.

DUE DILIGENCE REPORTS - Mr. Sacco referred the Committee to the Financial Fast Track chart contained within the agenda booklet. He reported that as of May 31st, the Fund's statutory surplus position is 12.8 million. Mr. Sacco added that the Fund is in excellent financial shape.

ATTORNEY:

Mr. Zabarsky advised that his report will be conducted during closed session.

SAFETY DIRECTOR:

Mr. Mirarchi reviewed the June activities and the July agenda. He advised the Committee of upcoming meetings and trainings. He then referred to the Safety Director's bulletins and announcements that were recently released enclosed within the agenda booklet. Mr. Mirarchi also referred to a recent J.A. Montgomery Law Enforcement Bulletin that was distributed to the membership with regard to pedestrian fatalities. Commissioner Singer asked if there was a breakdown of where the fatalities took place in Ocean County. Mr. Mirarchi said he would contact Mr. Hummel and request the breakdown.

UNDERWRITING MANAGER:

Mr. Thorpe referred to the list of certificates issued for the months of May and June.

RISK MANAGEMENT CONSULTANT:

Mr. Avalone informed the Board that the 2019 renewal data process has begun. He thanked the membership in advance for their cooperation with the process.

Mr. Avalone then referred to a memo from the MEL Underwriting Manager that was emailed to the membership previously and distributed to the Board prior to the start of the meeting. He recommended that the two items addressed in the memo, increased liability limit options and first party physical damage coverage for drones, be remanded to the Coverage Committee. Mr. Avalone added that a third topic, Certificate of Insurance requests, will be added to the discussion during the Coverage Committee meeting.

Mr. Avalone said the Police Command Staff Training session will likely be scheduled for early September and advised that the invite will be distributed in the upcoming weeks. He noted that the training is mandatory in accordance with the MEL's POL/EPL Compliance Program.

Mr. Avalone reminded the Board to review the MEL Bulletin regarding Fireworks Displays and Amusement Ride Requirements. He added that all paperwork must be submitted to the MEL for approval before the event takes place.

Mr. Avalone informed the Board that most of the membership has completed the required Managers and Supervisors training.

Mr. Avalone referred to a letter detailing this optional policy was sent to Fund Commissioners and Risk Managers via email on or about June 20th and mailed to members which included was the script for the Land Use Liability training as well as a member-specific policy document. He reminded the Board that the training script corresponds to a PowerPoint presentation conducted by the member's land use or municipal attorney. Mr. Avalone added that training attendance sheets should be returned to the fund office to track compliance in the event of a claim.

Mr. Avalone asked if there were any questions about his report. Commissioner Singer commented that there should be harassment training for elected officials. Mr. Avalone advised that harassment has been a training topic for elected officials in the past, but noted that the training topics are rotated. Commissioner Singer suggested that judges be included when the trainings are conducted.

Ms. Jacob referred to her report contained in the agenda booklet. She informed the Committee that for the month of June, there was a savings of \$225,778.09 or 52.16% on the medical billing for Workers' Compensation claims.

RESOLUTION NO. 19-18

RESOLUTION OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE OCEAN COUNTY MUNICIPAL JOINT INSURANCE FUND URGING THE LEGISLATURE TO AMEND S-716, S-477 AND S-1766

Whereas: The Ocean County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund insures 31 municipalities, and

Whereas: While it is commendable that legislation is being considered to provide additional compensation to Firefighters with cancer, S-716 as currently written, without responsible amendments, will prove to be very expensive to municipalities and taxpayers, and

Whereas: While it is also commendable that the statute of limitations is being extended for claims involving sexual abuse, S-477 as currently written would eliminate the statute of limitations entirely leaving officials and volunteers with the near impossible task of defending a claim that is decades old.

Whereas: Under current law family members can already collect substantial compensation for actual losses such as medical bills, lost income as well as loss of companionship.

Whereas: Without appropriate amendments, the combined impact of these bills would devastate local government insurance budgets at a time when the local taxpayers are being squeezed because of changes in the Federal Tax code.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Ocean County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund that:

- S-716 be <u>amended</u> to provide that the cancer presumption be limited to types of cancer that scientific evident establishes that Firefighters develop at a higher rate than the general public, and
- S-716 be <u>amended</u> to end the presumption at age 65 when the firefighter becomes eligible for Medicare. Alternatively, S-716 should be amended to remove volunteers and establish a special program for them along the lines recently adopted by New York, Connecticut, Michigan, Colorado and Georgia, and
- S-716 also be <u>amended</u> so that the standard to rebut the presumption remains at the current "preponderance of the evidence", and
- S-477 be <u>amended</u> to increase statute of limitation on claims involving sexual molestation against public entities to 7 years, subject to no limitation against the molester, and
- S-1766 be <u>amended</u> to remove public entities from "emotional distress" compensation for wrongful death claims subject to Title 59, and

A copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Governor, the legislative delegation representing Bergen County, the Governor, the Senate President and the Speaker of the Assembly.
