Newton, MA—Alderman and Candidate for Mayor of Newton Ken Parker visited City Hall today to kick off the official start of the campaign by taking out nomination papers to have his name listed on the September 15 Preliminary Election ballot.

“Today I'm taking out nomination papers for the race to be Newton's next Mayor," said Parker. “I ask all Newton residents who share our goal of modernizing management practices at Newton City Hall to sign my nomination papers and get involved with our campaign. Please join our effort. The long-term fiscal health of our City depends on it.”

Not long after Parker visited City Hall, his campaign team began reaching out to Newton residents city-wide asking for signatures and support for his bid for mayor. Parker Campaign volunteers will be stationed around Newton during the coming weeks. Anyone registered to vote in Newton can sign Alderman Parker’s nomination papers and there is no limit to the number of candidates’ papers that a voter can sign. Candidates are required to get 400 certified signatures to run in the September 15 Preliminary Election.
