Gentlemen,

Right lads here we go, another letter in on the history of our club as we prepare for the celebration of our "Golden 50th Anniversary". Thank you to our 50th Anniversary History Committee Members, for what they recall from memory. Now before I go any further, I want you all to take into account that these "Young Men" are trying to remember back nearly 50 years ago. We all know some of us can't even remember what we had for breakfast. ;-)

So give them credit for their memories, as I truly do. Soooo off we go...

FSOS History 1964 - 1974

The world changed dramatically during our first 10 years. A nation recovering from the tragic loss of a president fought against communism in the jungles of Vietnam and for civil rights in the towns and cities of our Nation. We saw the summer of love and we walked on the moon. In Old Bridge our changes were on a smaller scale...but they're still here. If you can remember them, well then you've been around for quite a bit yourself...and that's not a bad thing at all.

1964 Forty men gather together to march in the Newark St. Patrick's day parade and from this origins the "Friendly Sons of the Shillelagh" originated. The name was derived from a segment of the famous "Jackie Gleason Show". Our logo "Leprechaun on a Shamrock" was inspired by an image on the cover of a Bing Crosby LP (that's "long player" for you kids) titled, "Shamrocks and Shillelagh's". And yes, you can Google it. Membership requirements haven't changed...male over 21years old and 1/8th Irish ancestry

1966 This was the year our award winning Pipes and Drums were formed with just 11 members. In this same year a bid was submitted to Old Bridge Township for property on Oak St. It was paid for by 200 FSOS members who took out a bond worth \$150 each from Amboy Bank for the purchase of the property and mortgage. This made the husbands very popular with the wives...really. Construction started and a good percentage was done by FSOS members. This was also the beginning of the good and welfare program, established for benefit of members

1968 Two years after starting the construction was completed and building dedicated, we had a home. This was also the year we began another tradition... the annual blood drive was established. And to help us cope with the stress of all the work and giving... the annual golf tournament started. We're still hitting a lot of bogies on the way to the 19th hole.

1969 As our tradition of being a family oriented club grew we had the Fathers and Sons trip to a New York Yankees game. Followed for the first time by Thanksgiving day baskets delivered to 12 families. This would grow to 24 baskets per year and in recent years, 48 families per year. In the past 50 years our members have provided Thanksgiving Dinner to over a 1,000 families.

In 1969 Santa Ho-Ho-Ho'd his way into the lives FSOS children as we started a tradition that is maintained to this very day, The children's Christmas party and movie.

1970 After just 4 years in existence our Pipe Band and Members marched in both the New York City and Dublin parades in the same weekend. There was a little jet lag... but that's why God made Guinness. This year we established the scholarship fund for FSOS dependents and 44 years later we're still funding it.

1971 This year marked the first of four Irish Feis's hosted by the FSOS. It was first held at Freehold Raceway and in subsequent years moved to the Arts Center. This was a year for dancing and so it was that the 1st annual former FSOS presidents dance took place. Apparently news was spreading about us because an FSOS Charter was issued to West Orange, NJ...we were growing. This was also the year we hosted the Children's Olympics.

1973 With the list of recurring activities growing every year this year we added the Annual St. John of God Charity Dance to benefit the hospital

1974 A decade after starting we established "fund raiser" fund to help people in need of financial help. e.g. "Tony Fund" auto accident, a child mauled by a dog, medical emergencies, etc.
