In 1990, he joined the FSOS and since then has been involved in many projects at the club, such as renovation of the bar, building a shed, new siding on the building, renovation of our lounge, the Pavilion construction, repairs to both bathrooms, which had him working 10 - 12 hour days. He was also instrumental in getting our roof re-done and a new A.C. system installed at substantial savings to our club.

BEREAVEMENT COMMITTEE

The bereavement committee is put in place to help our members families during their darkest hours. We help them, first of all by sending someone to their home to represent the friendly sons, to give our respects and to help them by offering them a piper for the funeral, members in uniform to act as pall bearers/ honor guard and anything else that we can possibly help them with. As a member in good standing they are entitled to a repast luncheon at the club for all of their guests, we then need to know how many guests they are expecting. How is that for a tough question we usually ask a family member at the wake how many people they are expecting, no one can really answer that question so we look at the size of the wake and we guess. For those of you who do not know Barney Shannon orders a large floral arrangement in the shape of a shamrock, for this time is of the essence we have to give the florist enough notice to order the flowers necessary to create our piece. If you know of the passing of a member please call Barney as soon as possible, don't wait for someone else to call him. (732-254-6153) we then have to get the word out to hundreds of members.

We are now sending it out three ways: You will receive :

- 1. A personal phone call.
- 2. An E-mail notification.

3. A computer generated phone call.

If all else fails you can probably get the information off the board at the club.

The message will state the members name, the name of the funeral director, what days and times the wake is, what time we will be meeting at the club. We ask you to please attend the wake in full uniform. As you know we attend the wake to support the family of the deceased. You are there to show them support at probably the worst time of their lives. I have personally seen this from both sides as a member of the family of the deceased, and as a club member supporting the family of a deceased member. A member of a family will tell you that the sea of green blazers that was overwhelming the room seemed like it went on forever. Please help us to make the family proud at their saddest moment. At this point I am in need of a few volunteers, we still need call captains for the call out. We are looking to form a list of available pall bearers/honor guard members. If a family member of a member or a friend of the club passes on you will be notified by an e-mail message I am told that at this time only about half of the club is on the E-mail list. This will be your only notification so get your E-mail information to Dave Cummins.

Your bereavement committee consists of Bob Quinn, Larry McGrath, Tom Keegan, Jim Hartwyk, John Sheridan, and Ray Costello.

Repast luncheons

The repast luncheon is the nicest way the FSOS helps the family of a brother member in their hour of need. The last thing the family wants to worry about is where to have a meal after the funeral. The Bereavement committee makes the call, the spouses committee gets an approximate number of people that will be attending. The spouses committee then does the shopping and the night before the funeral they cook and prepare the hall. The day of the funeral they finish cooking, serve and clean up. We offer any leftover food to the family. The families are extremely grateful for all that is done. The FSOS should be commended for what they do for the family as they will always remember it.
