



## Is YOUR campus giving you the coverage you need?

The new health care law requires insurance plans that started on or after August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012, to cover key women's preventive health care, like birth control, without co-pays! Since student plans start after August 1<sup>st</sup>, most plans *should* be covering these services without additional costs. We want to make sure you're getting the care promised to you by the law!

**Here are some ways to find out if your school's student health plan has made the change. Once you figure it out, visit the link at the bottom of the page or scan the QR code. Let us know what you found out so we can help you take action and make sure students on your campus are getting the benefits of the health care law!**

### **Contact the student health center.**

At small colleges, student health insurance is likely to be run through the student health center. Contact the staff member in charge of enrolling students in your college's health plan and ask if contraception is now covered by the insurance plan at no cost. If it isn't, ask why.

### **Check your e-mail.**

At some colleges and universities, school administrators have e-mailed the student body to let them know about changes in their student insurance plans. Your school may even tell you that these changes are happening because of the Affordable Care Act!

### **Check online.**

Many schools, especially medium to large universities, post their plan descriptions on their school web sites. Visit your student health center's web site or search the web for your school's plan and see if it is posted online.

Look for links such as "Full Plan Details" or "Plan Benefits" to find the details of your school's plan. Scan for references to contraceptives and other preventive services. They may be listed under "Family Planning," "Reproductive Health," "Maternity Care," or a similar title.
