Membership Structures:

This year the DMC has been contemplating our structures around membership at GoW. A survey was done in the spring revealing many concerns regarding our present structures. The DMC is now reviewing a new membership structure called 'Ways to Engage'. Essentially, this proposal completely separates membership from which meetings you attend. If you have strong feelings or good ideas regarding this subject, please talk with a Servant Leader or DMC member, so that we have better information with which to make a decision. For all those who completed the survey in the spring, we still have the responses that you gave us, and have gone over those results with the DMC.

Sexual Orientation Conversation:

In November, the Sharing & Learning Circle started viewing a series of presentations led by Dan Epp-Thiessen and Michael Pahl from a conference entitled "Seeking to be Faithful together: The Bible and Same Sex Relationships", sponsored by Mennonite Church Manitoba. The event was organized in response to a request that Mennonite Church Manitoba declare a position on homosexual people in the church. The conference attempts to offer opportunity to learn what Scripture says and how it is used to support, bolster, or defend all positions.

While going through this series of presentations may not bring us to a clear decision; it is giving us shared experience and shared learning. It is giving us words and opportunity to push the limits of our understanding of who God is and where God is leading the church in the 21st century. As we learn and listen, we are also becoming gentler and less defensive, more willing to listen and try to understand. We are finding more and better language to explain our own thoughts and thereby hearing and understanding one another better. We know that this has been a difficult conversation at times, and that this has been hard work for all of us. We are hopeful and optimistic that the hard work is leading us closer to one another, and to God.

These times of learning through the generosity of Dan & Michael are open to anyone in GOW. So, come join us in January and March. Become part of the discussion, part of the discernment into God's future for GOWCC.

The next steps in this conversation will involve the SLT taking a proposal to the Advisory Team in February and then to the DMC in March or April. We encourage all members to attend the above sessions and also to approach Servant Leaders and DMC members with their thoughts and feelings about the conversation.
