# The Cost of Discipleship

#### WHAT'S THE POINT?

Jesus tells us that in comparison to our dedication to Him, all earthly relationships should amount to nothing. If he is not our first thought and action, we are not disciples. Jesus doesn't make discipleship out to be an easy thing. It involves carrying his cross and putting all else aside. Priests and religious have taken vows of discipleship, leaving families to take up the cross and giving up their possessions. There are many people who have responded in this way to Jesus' call. They have counted the cost and have been willing to pay the price. In our lives also the hindrances of the world can be exchanged for eternal life in Christ.

### Saintly Examples: St. Ephrem

St. Ephrem was born in Mesopotamia at the beginning of the 4th century to a pagan family. Because St. Ephrem was drawn to Christianity, his father forced him to leave home. He was then baptized a Christian and went on to be a famous teacher, known for his scholarship in the Scriptures. He was ordained a deacon and fought to uphold the true Catholic doctrine against the many heresies of his day. He was one of the first to introduce the singing of hymns into the Church. Besides hymns he wrote many other works which were translated into other languages. He lived a simple life, dwelling in a cave near Edessa (in Iraq). He is known as a Doctor of the Church. (Saint for September 5: Blessed Mother Teresa of Calucutta)
