This is a golden opportunity for the SCV and with the help of all Colorado Compatriots we can make this a very successful time within our state and for the organization as a whole.



Additionally, during his "free time" at the Reunion, Gary was able to visit the grave sites of two of his collateral ancestors (Leacel L. Chiles and Wade H. Chiles) at the New Liberty Baptist Church Cemetery at Travelers Rest, South Carolina.

Private L. L. Chiles was a member of a South Carolina Artillery unit stationed on Sullivan Island prior to the "official" start of "The War for Southern Independence". His battery was one of the gun emplacements that shelled Fort Sumter (April 12-14, 1861).

Upon his return home, Commander Parrott is busy at work on several SCV projects. He is in the final stages of approving the applications of several new members and the presentation of several "War Service Medals".

- Lee/Jackson banquet will be held on Saturday, January 22, 2012 from 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM. Location TBD



Historic Greeley Potato Days Supports SCV Displays

CO Confederate Graves Photo Project

In May 2010, I started a project to register all of our known Confederate Veterans Graves in Colorado and am very close to finishing it up. It has been an arduous (and somewhat tedious) task.

The website Interment list has over 480 entries and the MS Word Document which Gary Parrot and Terry Wabnitz provided has over 470. I have researched each entry to verify, as best I could, that they are legitimate Confederate Veterans and are indeed buried in Colorado. I used the Colorado Veterans' Graves Registration website

(http://www.colorado.gov/dpa/doit/archives/military/graves/); the National Parks Service Soldiers and Sailors System website (http://www.itd.nps.gov/cwss/); the U.S. War Archives website

(http://files.usgwarchives.org/co/); and several others in my research.

To date, I have completed 412 Grave Registrations, compiling a list of 57 changes which need to be made to the Interment listings; and, I have a list of 68 names to delete from the Interment list.

The entries to be deleted are those names for which I could not verify service to the CSA or for which there is no cemetery information available. We will maintain this list in case someone wants to complete any further research. I am also finishing up research/waiting for more information on another 12 entries.


This project will ensure that the Confederate Veterans buried in Colorado will be on file/recorded permanently with the SCV Headquarters in Columbia, TN. This is a great way to honor the memories of the brave Confederate Soldiers and Sailors who served the CSA and who helped to make Colorado such a great State!

The Sons of Confederate Veterans met for their 115th Annual Reunion at the Civil Center, July 21-24, 2010, in Anderson, South Carolina, In attendance, during this business meeting and gala event, were many Headquarters, Department, Division and Camp officers.

Also, in attendance were many members of Allied Orders (United Daughters of the Confederacy, Order of the Confederate Rose, Children of the Confederacy, etc.) and several public officials.

Mayor Terence Roberts, State Attorney General Henry McMaster and State Representative Dan Cooper were just a few of the keynote speakers that gave "greetings" during the Opening Ceremonies.

Among the VIPs and delegates were two "Real Sons"-James Brown and H. V. Booth. Brown, 98, from Loudon, Tennessee, and Booth, 91, from Elberton, Georgia, are considered two of only approximately 30 known "Real Sons" of Confederate Veterans still alive.

Gary Parrott, Commander of the Governor C. S. Thomas Camp No. 2126 (Grand Junction) represented the Colorado Division. This was the seventh Annual Reunion he has attended.

"This was the best Reunion I have been to, and I plan on being at the next one," Parrott said.

The 2011 Reunion will be held in Montgomery, Alabama, July 14-16, 2011. More information will be forthcoming in future issues of the Confederate Veteran magazine.
