## But What About ... ?

### Common Household Hazardous Waste

**Gasoline** (old) may be strained through a paper filter and diluted with fresh gasoline by one half. This mixture may sometimes be used in your lawnmower, but be sure to check the owners' manual.

**Latex and oil paint** can be disposed of safely in three ways:

1. Use it up. If you don't have very much paint, spread it on cardboard or newspaper. Let it dry and discard it with your regular trash.
2. If you have a half a can or less of paint, open the can and let it dry out in a well-ventilated area. Keep it away from an open-flame, rain, children or pets. To speed the drying process, add equal amounts of absorbent material, such as kitty litter or a product called Paint Hardener. When completely dried out, discard with your regular trash.
3. Full or nearly full cans of usable paint can usually be donated. Try contacting local churches, housing programs, or school art, local theater or drama departments.

Abitibi-Bowater recycles office paper, magazines, newspapers, mail and wrapping paper (NO foil wrapping paper or tissue paper). They DO NOT take phone books or cardboard.

## What Are Other Ways To Recycle

### Composting

Composting returns organic material to the soil in a usable form. Organic matter in the soil has been proven to improve plant growth.

Three easy ways to compost:

1. Leave your grass clippings on your yard after mowing. Leaving the clippings will return valuable nutrients to the lawn.
2. According to a 2003 study, the average American household throws away 470 pounds of food waste every year. Composting is an obvious way to cut down on this waste. Recycle your kitchen waste (do not use meat or dairy products), newspapers, sawdust and yard waste. Put the material in a bin with enough soil to cover. You must keep the waste moist and turn occasionally. Use the compost on your garden, around your trees and shrubs for better plant growth. 3. If you do not have room for composting, you can take your yard waste to a local composting businesses such as Elm Recycling, Hope Timber or The Compost Farm.

### Green Products

There is an array of Green Products being offered to consumers at the local supermarket. Green Products can be thought of in many ways. What makes a product green? The answer to this question can be very complicated. Generally, a product may be considered "green" if it demonstrates an efficient use of material; if the product is reusable, recyclable, or compostable; how much of the products is made from post-consumer recycled content or from biobased and sustainable sourced products. Another way to look at a "green product" could review how the product is made by focusing on energy and water conservation or low-impact operations that avoid hazardous materials and promotion of low-emitting and sustainable practices.
