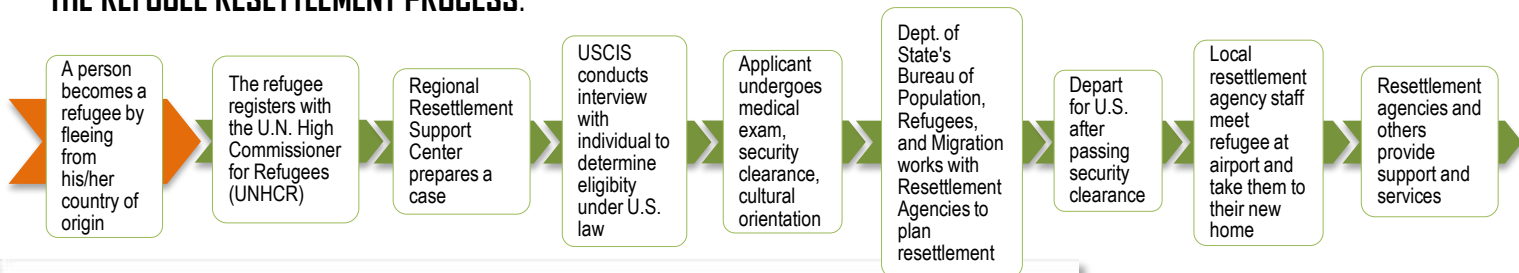


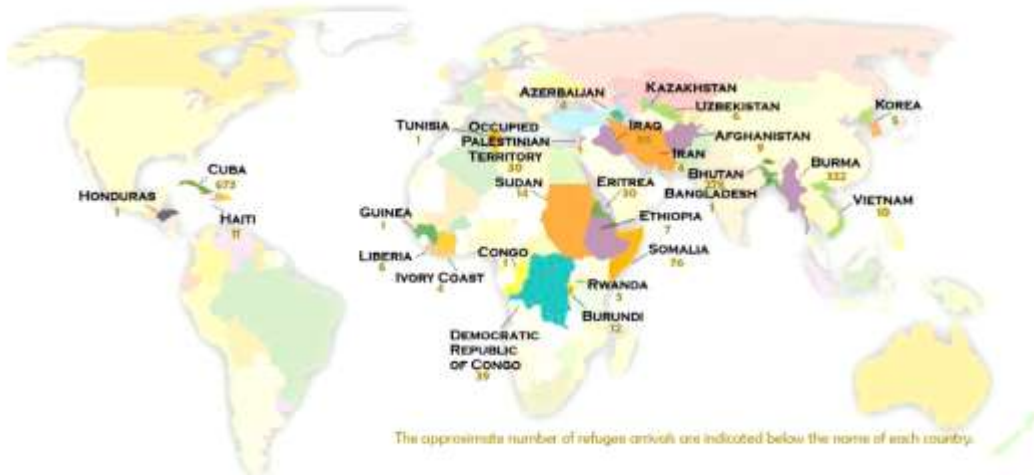


WHO WE ARE: The Kentucky Office for Refugees (KOR) the Kentucky State Refugee Coordinator's office and administers Federal funding associated with the resettlement and integration of refugees. The office provides leadership, policy guidance and advocacy on issues affecting the refugee resettlement network. It contracts with agencies in Louisville, Lexington, Bowling Green and Owensboro to work with refugees in securing employment, pursuing educational opportunities, accessing appropriate healthcare, and becoming self-sufficient.

THE REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT PROCESS:



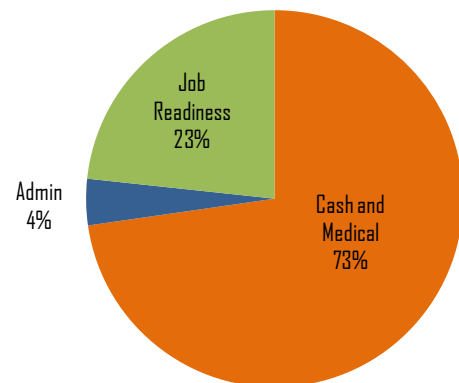
COUNTRIES OF ORIGIN OF REFUGEE ARRIVALS IN LOUISVILLE, 2010-PRESENT
