COLORADO SPRUCE *Picea pungens*

Zones 3 4 5 6
and north in zone

Broadly conical tree, rigid branches with stiff needles.
Height 5-10' (1.5-3m) in about 10 years, matures
to 80-120' (24-36m)

Needles light green; color holds all year.

Soil: moist and well-drained.

Light: full sun.

Tolerates wind.

Pruning: rarely needed. Trim in July if necessary.

Uses: specimen or accent tree — needs fairly large space

Avoid planting Colorado Spruce near Douglas Fir which
is an alternate host for the Cooley Spruce Gall Aphid.



AUSTRIAN or AUSTRIAN BLACK PINE *Pinus nigra*

Zones 4 5 6 7 8
plus north in zone 10

Symmetrical when young, loses lower branches with age.
Rapid growth to height 10-15' (3-4.5m) in 15 years;
matures to 50-100' (15-30m).

Needles in pairs, very dark green contrasting with
yellow-green of new growth each spring.

Soil: almost any. Tolerates poor, rocky, sandy, alkaline and
clay conditions.

Light: full sun.

Tolerates urban pollution and coastal climates.

Uses: screens and windbreaks, specimen or accent,
roadside, where salt spray drifts.
