LINDA GUNTER specializes in the nuclear power-nuclear weapons connection, the myths surrounding the French nuclear program and in human rights and the nuclear fuel chain. In addition she works on media and development. With her husband, Paul Gunter, she co-authored the 2001 landmark report, *Licensed to Kill*, exposing the high toll taken on animal life – especially endangered sea turtles – due to the routine operation of coastal nuclear reactors.
