

This year, Davidson County voters will elect a new mayor and a new city council who will serve our city for the next four years. The first election was held on August 6th. In every race where no candidate received more than 50% of the total vote, the top two candidates are going to a run-off election. **The run-off election will be held on September 10th** (with early voting from August 21-September 5th).

Every voter can vote for **one person** they want to be the Mayor of Nashville. After the August 6th election, there are now only two candidates running to be the mayor.





WRITE-IN

Voters have the option to “write in” the name of an individual that they want to vote for who is not officially on the ballot. If you vote for a “write-in” candidate, you cannot vote for one of the candidates listed on the ballot.

Council Members At-Large

There are five Council Members At-Large on the Metro Council. These five people represent the entire county. Each household in Davidson County is represented by one district council member and all five at-large council members.




On the September 10th ballot there are 10 people running for 5 at-large seats. Each voter will have the opportunity to vote for up to five of these candidates.

You can choose to vote for less than five individuals, giving your vote for certain candidates more weight. For example, if you only voted for three of the twenty-six candidates, your vote for the three candidates will count as slightly more than one vote per candidate.

District Council Members

Every household in Davidson County is located in a council district. Many council elections were decided in the August 6th election. In many districts, one candidate received more than 50% of the votes and has been elected. Only voters who live in districts 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 13, 17, 20, and 23 will vote on their council member on September 10th.



District Council Members

The sample ballot shows all of the candidates for each of the 9 council district races. When you go to vote, you will only see the candidates in your council district on your ballot. If you do not live in one of these districts you will not vote on any district council race.
