Revisiting Electronic Dance Music!

xactly one year ago, almost to the day, we took a look at Electronic Dance Music, and wondered if Alt radio was doing everything it could to embrace the burgeoning scene that was drawing over 30,000 young adults to various events. I don't want to take any of the credit, but one of the songs recommended in that article, "Midnight City" by M83, soon thereafter took off on its march to the top. Since that time, Skrillex found his way onto numerous playlists. Stations like Live 105 made EDM a much bigger part of their regular rotations. And just a couple of weeks ago, KROQ added Deadmaus to their official playlist. So I asked APD/ MD Lisa Worden if there was a conscious effort to include more EDM to the KROQ sound.

Not really, it turns out. "Honestly, it's not something we're 'purposely' doing," Lisa explained. "We add great songs that we think our audience will love. However,

'Professional Griefers' is one of the most 'radio' EDM songs I've heard. It has a great hook and sounds awesome on the radio!"

Yes, in the end, it always does come down to the songs. But as a genre? Slacker Radio has seen explosive year-to-year growth overall, and their electronic stations have even outpaced those gains. They've also recently done extensive research on the subject

of EDM. Mat Bates, the Radio Program Manager at Slacker who has been privy to the numbers, has a very interesting perspective:

"Something struck me when I worked at 91X and I studied the history of that station from the perspective of the folks that built it. I think there's an outside perception that stations like 91X, KROQ, and WFNX 'created' Alternative music. In fact, they were just savvy enough to capitalize on a scene and culture that was already happening. They didn't create these bands, this sound, this community—they just main-

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streamed it and packaged it as a radio format."

That is absolutely true. When I began programming a brand new Live 105 in the '80s, I had the exact same insight. We were just serving a community that had no other home on the radio dial.

"I think that's where we are at with a new genre of Pop music, for lack of a better term, and that encompasses emerging Hip Hop, EDM of all flavors, and Alt-leaning Electronic textures," says Bates, who's about to launch a new station that marries all of those sounds together.

As for Alt radio, Bates advice hasn't changed much from a year ago, when he suggested that PDs take a measured approach to this music style. "All I was saying then is that in the context of commercial radio, especially Alt, we have to learn from the mistakes of the past. Remember ten years ago when we abandoned our identities and heritage so that we could enthusiastically go all in on Active Rock? No brand, radio or otherwise, should ever do that. We should anticipate trends, not chase them. We should reflect the contemporary interests of our customers, and we should continue to evolve with that in mind. Evolve—incremental change informed by objective decisions. And maybe capitalize on the popularity of this music

with your audience, before someone else comes along and 'owns' it."

Last year, we also talked to Party
Ben. He's a noted DJ who makes
remixes and does freelance audio
work, after serving as Live 105's
Imaging Director. I noted that when
we last spoke, Ben was lamenting
that Alt radio was so "Rock" leaning,
that EDM wasn't easy to mix in. But
that isn't true anymore.

He enthuses, "It's been a huge change that's been amazing to watch. Electronic music is suddenly bigger than ever on Alternative radio. I'd say even surpassing the 'electronica' era itself of the late '90s." Ben notices that it's not unusual to see an electronic tune cropping up at least once an hour, and he claims the sound seems to 'fit' with the Rock titles better than ever.

KROQ's Worden concurs. I asked her if from a music scheduling standpoint, she has a problem making an M83, Deadmau5, or Skrillex track fit into the normal mix? "Not really," she replied. "With the state of what's hot right now these fit right in. Alex Clare, M83, Gotye, The Killers, Grouplove, Foster the People—all of these are what you hear on KROQ right now. So Skrillex and Deadmau5 sound great in that mix. And the new Muse record is going to blow everyone away."





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Cementing A Place (Con't)

Even the Rock-leaning Alt stations have little to fear according to the DJ, Party Ben. The way he perceives it, electronic music has been utterly dominant in American culture for quite a while now, so Rock listeners' ears are more accepting of that sound than they were even five years ago.

Ben suggests that, "it's still TV commercials that usually 'break' electronic tracks—like M83 and Nero—but they catch on because they're good and the public is hungry

for them, so one would think that there's a huge opportunity for Alt radio to get out in front on unique, attention-grabbing

songs like these before the TV ads do. If Victoria's Secret will take the risk, why can't radio?"

Bates, who programmed terrestrial radio at KXTE, KRZQ, and KQXR prior to Slacker, reflects on the Electronic Dance Music subject and sums it up nicely. "I grew up listening to great Alt radio in the '90s. And some of my favorite songs were electronic tracks like Sunscreem's 'Love U More', Saint Ettiene's 'Only Love Will Break Your Heart', Dubstar's 'Stars', or Moodswings' 'Spiritual High'. I was only a kid, but my guess is that radio programmers didn't over think things so much then. They just played good music without getting hung up on arbitrary genre tags and worrying about if another station already 'owned' this sound."

Electronic Dance Music Tips

Last year, our panelists were very successful in picking the EDM tunes that went on to massive radio success. Here are a few new suggestions from Slacker's Mat Bates: "It seems that the pattern is for terrestrial stations to kind of rediscover EDM songs that have been out for a year or two and present them as 'new,' so with that in mind, both Miami Horror's 'Sometimes' and Strange Talk's 'Climbing Walls' are songs that are demonstrably hits for Slacker. Nero and Chase & Status make incredibly accessible, anthemic songs that would not sound at all out of place on a traditional radio station. And I really, really love St Lucia and the new Ice Choir record."
