

About the ACM...

VISION

To glorify God and help build His holy Church through full-time pan-Orthodox OCF ministry in Annapolis to students of both St. John's College (SJCA) and the United States Naval Academy (USNA).

GOALS

Present Orthodox Christians and inquirers at both SJCA and the USNA with regularly-scheduled opportunities for Orthodox worship;

Provide Orthodox Christians and the many inquirers interested in learning about Orthodoxy with opportunities for study and application of the Orthodox Faith;

Pastor the students in the Orthodox Faith by actively seeking them out, meeting with them, and sharing God's love and concern for them at this critical and formative time in their lives;

Enable volunteers to exercise their own gifts for ministry by helping to build Christ's holy Church.

FUNDING AND ACCOUNTABILITY

This Pan-Orthodox College Ministry is a full-time local ministry under a Board of Directors;

The Board of Directors is composed of a representative from each local parish contributing financially to the ministry, and, when possible, one Orthodox rep. each from the USNA and SJCA;

On-going priestly supervision of the ministry is presently under Archpriest Gregory Mathewes-

Green and the Very Reverend Fr. Constantine White.

WORSHIP

Readers Vespers weekly, daily evening prayers on campus, as well as other Divine Services.

TEACHING

Sub-deacon Robert advises and leads these two OCF (Orthodox Christians Fellowship) groups in weekly meetings, teaching the Orthodox Faith using the Holy Scriptures and the Church Fathers;

Additional teaching at other times, e.g., Orthodox ethics and praxis, as well as Church History.

EVANGELISM

Having a full-time, on-campus Orthodox college chaplain increases the opportunities to meet with students when they are free. To date, 7 students and faculty have come to Christ and holy Orthodoxy through ACM. A number of other students are currently journeying to the Orthodox Faith and meeting weekly with Sbdn. Robert for studies in the Orthodox Faith.

DISCIPLESHIP

Ongoing, personal pastoring and mentoring of Orthodox students and others, as well as catechesis of inquirers.



SUB-DEACON ROBERT MICLEAN
Chairman & Pastoral Assistant

Sub-deacon Robert Miclean is full-time Pastoral Assistant for the St. John's College and U.S. Naval Academy chapters of the OCF (Orthodox Christian Fellowship), the nationwide pan-Orthodox college ministry.

From 2002-June 2005, he served under Fr. Gregory Mathewes-Green as Pastoral Assistant for College and Youth Ministries at Holy Cross Orthodox Church in Linthicum, MD, where he built up a new youth ministry for 25 Middle School and High School teens and pioneered discipleship groups, a small-group mentoring ministry for Orthodox teens. During that time, he also began an outreach ministry to students in the area, working with those students to start two new OCF ministries in Annapolis.

With the blessing of his bishop, Sub-deacon Robert serves as full-time chaplain to the Annapolis campuses. In his pastoral role, he has catechized and sponsored students, alumni and faculty. He meets regularly with students inquiring into the Orthodox faith. In addition, he leads a weekly Vespers service, daily evening prayers and studies in the Orthodox Faith.
