Each week 31 people volunteer at the Pantry. They assist families; pick up food from the Greater Chicago Food Depository and sort and stock donations. DEDICATION CEREMONY AND HISTORIC CANNON FIRING AT HILLSIDE CEMETERY

On Sunday morning, August 16th, 2015 a dedication ceremony honoring the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) gravesite will be held at Hillside Cemetery. The ceremony will begin at 11:00 AM. Civil War re-enactors from Taylor's Battery, complete with a cannon firing, will help lead the dedication ceremony honoring the GAR. The GAR is an organization founded by Civil War veterans and is based on the principles of fraternity, charity and loyalty. The GAR founded soldiers' rest homes and worked to improve soldiers' pension legislation.

The Palatine Historical Society raised funds to purchase a memorial bench inscribed with GAR to sit by the grave plots.

A bronze plaque next to the bench will give a brief history of the GAR. Palatine Township is proud to have partnered, once again, with the Historical Society to help improve our historic cemeteries. Palatine Township owns and maintains five pioneer cemeteries. Many of the areas founders are buried in these cemeteries.

Please mark your calendars and plan on attending what is sure to be a stirring dedication ceremony on Sunday, August 16th, 11:00 AM at historic Hillside Cemetery in Palatine. Hillside Cemetery is directly north of the intersection of Smith Street and Colfax (also just north of the Northwestern Train station) with the main entrance off of Smith Street.

Kathy's work with all of these programs has been achieved with patience, a friendly word, and always a smile. Kathy helps people feel better about themselves, and life.

It is her work with BraveHearts that may be the least known, but the greatest reward. After surviving ovarian cancer, Marge Gunnar knew she was destined for something better. Marge founded BRAVEHEARTS in October of 2002 and Kathy was one of the first volunteers.

BraveHeart's began offering therapeutic riding and carriage driving programs for wounded military and veterans in 2007. Under the auspices of PATH International, BraveHeart's is currently the largest veterans' therapeutic riding program in the United States and a leading representative of Equine Assisted Activities and Therapies (EAAT). Palatine Township veterans' have been fortunate to benefit from this therapy.

FOURTH OF JULY FESTIVALS

If you're looking to have some fun and celebrate the 4th of July then the festivals in Palatine Township are for you. Great carnival rides, fabulous entertainment, good food and refreshments as well as parades and fireworks. Everything you and your family need to celebrate our nation's independence.

Palatine Township will be participating in the Palatine Jaycee Fourth of July Festival, Hometown Fest. At the beginning of their parade which is on July 4th starting at a new time, 11:00 AM, elected officials and volunteers from Palatine Township will be collecting food and cash donations for the Palatine Township Food Pantry. Palatine's festival runs from July 2nd through July 5th. Fireworks are on Friday, July 3rd at dusk and Family Day is Sunday, July 5th at 1:00 PM.

Hoffman Estates is sponsoring a four day Independence Day celebration called Northwest Fourth Fest at the Sears Centre Arena in Hoffman Estates. This year's festival will run from

July 1st through July 5th. The parade and the fireworks will both be on Saturday, July 4th and the Arts and Crafts Fair will be on both Saturday the 4th and Sunday the 5th.

Arlington Heights will be celebrating the 40th anniversary of their Fourth of July Festival, Frontier Days. Frontier Days runs from Wednesday, July 1st through Sunday, July 5th. The Saturday, July 4th parade is themed "40 Years Of Volunteers Bringing Our Community Together." Musical entertainment will include 7th Heaven, Blackhawk and the Outlaw, Dennis DeYoung, Vertical Horizon and American English.

Rolling Meadows will have all of their celebration on July 4th. Their parade kicks off at 11:30 AM and the fireworks display goes off at dusk. Since this is Rolling Meadow's 60th anniversary, according to Mayor Tom Rooney, this year's fireworks will be bigger and better to celebrate the anniversary.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR GAS AND ELECTRIC BILLS

Palatine Township General Assistance office serves as an intake site for two programs that assist residents facing high winter heating bills.

1. The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) provides income qualified residents with a one-time credit toward their gas and/or electric bills. This program is administered by CEDA, but you can apply in our General Assistance office. There is a graduated enrollment period that begins in September.

2. The Nicor Sharing Program provides grants once a year to qualifying residential customers. This program is administered through the Salvation Army and funded by direct contributions from Nicor employees and customers.

A caseworker in the General Assistance office would be happy to assist you in applying for these programs and others for which you might qualify.

COOK COUNTY VEHICLE STICKERS: FOR UNINCORPORATED RESIDENTS ONLY.

Your Vehicle Stickers must be displayed on your automobile by July 1. Come visit the Township Center to pick yours up if you haven't already done so. If you purchase your sticker after July 1, you will be charged a late penalty equal to the price of the sticker or \$25, whichever is greater. Please note that the Township Board approved an additional \$3 Convenience Fee for each sticker purchased. You also may be subject to additional penalties if your sticker is not displayed by July 1.

Seniors take note: If you have turned 65 by July 1, you can receive a No Fee Sticker (unincorporated seniors only) which will remain effective for as long as you own your vehicle. The discount is limited to two (2) passenger vehicles or trucks weighing less than 10,000 lbs. Senior large truck, motorcycle, or trailer owners are required to pay full price for those stickers. Proof of age is required.

PALATINE TOWNSHIP CONTINUES TO HONOR MILITARY FAMILIES THROUGH ITS BLUE STAR BANNER PROGRAM.

The Palatine Township Board has had the privilege of honoring dozens of military families since the inception of its Blue Star Banner Program in June of 2011. PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS LOWER YOUR TAXES

At the Assessor's Office we are often asked how Property tax exemptions will help lower your property tax bill. It is important to make sure you are receiving all the exemptions to which you are entitled. Some exemptions renew automatically, while others must be applied for each year. Cook County is responsible for mailing the needed forms to taxpayers. Here is a listing of the most common exemptions with a brief explanation:

- Senior Citizen and Senior Freeze exemptions. You must apply for *each* of these exemptions every year. The senior freeze is also based on household income, which must be \$55,000 or less (*please call the Township for specifics*).
- Homeowner exemption application is available if you have owned and lived in your property as of Jan 1st of the taxing year.
- Disabled Person exemption can apply if you were disabled or became disabled during the year.
- Disabled Veteran exemption is for a vet who has at least a 50% service-connected disability. First time filers will need form DD214, provided by the Department of Defense.
- Returning Veteran exemption provides a one-time \$5,000 reduction to the assessed value of the veteran's residence *for the taxable year* that the veteran returns from active duty.

Your Palatine Township Assessor's Office will have all the necessary forms and is available to assist you with filing. WATER QUALITY

Water is the foundation for everything we do throughout life. It is of course needed for human existence but also used for recreation and economic development. However, not much of the water on the Earth is fit for consumption. Ninety seven percent of the Earth's water is salt water, while the rest is frozen in glaciers or polluted. In fact, 780 million people or one in nine, lack access to clean water. We are fortunate to live near the Great Lakes, which is the largest group of fresh water lakes on the planet and represent 84% of North America's surface fresh water. Urban runoff is threatening these bodies of fresh water and public awareness needs to be present.

Stormwater and urban runoff pollution comes from neighborhood streets, ditches, storm sewers construction sites and parking lots. This runoff contains pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers from landscaped lawns and gardens, improper disposal of used oil and engine fluids into open lid manholes and soil erosion from construction sites. Your support as residents of the community is essential to improve our water quality. Proper maintenance, responsible use of fertilizers and correct waste disposal are just a few solutions to keep our creeks and streams clean. We must do our part together to improve the water quality of our creeks and streams so we may continue living in a healthy ecosystem.

STORM CLEANUP

During the summer months, we typically experience a couple strong storms with winds that cause downed trees. After these powerful storms pass and roadways have been cleared, Palatine Township road crews are dispatched to clean-up and collect storm damage from private properties. If you live in the INCORPORATED areas of Palatine, Inverness or Rolling Meadows, call your municipality as they will schedule a pick up based on the extent of damage. If you experience a downed tree due to a storm event and live in the UNICORPORATED area, please call 847-358-6336 to schedule a pickup. We will only collect storm damage if the debris has been placed with branch or cut side facing the edge of the street. If you have small brush or branches, please tie them with twine in bundles four feet or less in length and two feet or less in diameter. By doing so, they will be more manageable for disposal and we will be able to assist your neighbors more effectively and efficiently.



STORM SEWER INSTALLATION

Stormwater drainage is a key component to the design, function and longevity of the roadway pavement. In order to protect our roadway it is necessary to have the correct drainage. Premature failure of the asphalt pavement and granular subbase may occur if stormwater is not transferred away from the roadway. There are several ways to handle this drainage, however the two most recognizable are curb and gutter designs or open ditches with cross culverts. Inlets, catch basins and manholes, are used in both cases to collect and transfer stormwater to sewers, which carry it away from the roadway. Sewers then properly discharge the stormwater to receiving areas such as ponds, wetlands or creeks. At Palatine Township Road District we carefully install and maintain curb and gutter systems, storm sewers, open ditches as well as any cross culverts under driveways and roadways. Therefore, if any standing stormwater is noticed please contact us and we will investigate to ensure proper drainage is met.

LETTER FROM THE SUPERVISOR

When was the last time you saw the Illinois insect symbol, the Monarch Butterfly?

Palatine Township will be helping the Monarch Butterfly, whose population is down 80%. In collaboration with the Save Our Monarch Foundation (SAVEOURMONARCHS.ORG) milkweed seeds, a staple for Monarchs, will be free for all residents who will participate in growing milkweed at their home.
