FOOD PANTRY

To the many generous Food Pantry donors this past holiday season, individuals and families who made food and monetary donations, individuals, businesses and schools who sponsored Food Drives: we send our heartfelt Thanks! Volunteers are still sorting and stocking the



amazing donation from Lavelle Law. Two truckloads of nonperishable food and household items were delivered during Thanksgiving.

Your generosity allows us to provide free groceries, meat, eggs, cheese, milk, fresh produce, personal and cleaning products to over 350 families each month. Approximately 900 individuals depend on our Pantry for nutritious food for themselves and their children. Of those we serve, 40% are under the age of 18.

Consider the situation of one of our recent clients – an on-the-job injury caused him to be on disability. When his benefits ended, he wasn't able to make ends meet for his family. For the first time in his life, instead of helping the needy, he found that he and his family were the ones in need. He confessed that the first time he came to use the Township Pantry he sat in the parking lot for 30 minutes before getting the courage to come in. After using the Pantry for a few months, he shared with us his relief at being treated with respect and genuine care by the staff and volunteers. He was able to provide for his family with the assistance of the Township until he found another job.

Soon the weather will take a turn for the better. Residents will want to get out and travel to the different destinations in the Township using our Township bus.

TRANSPORTATION FOR THE ELDERLY AND DISABLED

"I am a senior citizen who has lived in Palatine for over 30 years," wrote one Palatine Township resident. "I no longer can drive because of my aging eyes. The bus transportation service that Palatine Township offers to its senior citizens, who no longer can drive to provide these services for themselves, is excellent and needed."

If you are at least 65 years old or disabled, you can receive low cost, curb to curb transportation services Monday through Friday through the Township. The Township has at their disposal two twelve person mini buses and a 9 person passenger van. The first pickup for the day is at 8:15 AM for appointments at 9:00 AM. The last pickup for the day is at 3:00 PM.

Our bus transportation can also be used to save time with your errands. "I am very grateful for the transportation provided by Palatine Township," writes another resident. "This wonderful service enables my mother, who lives with me a number of days throughout the month, to visit my father living at Rosewood Care Center."

If you need to do some shopping, the Township has special excursions to area malls such as Woodfield, Randhurst, Deer Park, Kohl's and Trader Joe's. According to another resident, the service can also just help you get around the Township. "I utilize the bus for transportation to my eye doctor, to the beauty salons for my hair appointments, and to food stores. I also use the bus for transportation to the library for book discussions, books and DVDs."

Passengers must sign up for the program at the Palatine Township office a minimum of three days in advance. The fee is \$2.50 each way and an attendant can ride for free. Taxi vouchers are also available which are good for \$4.00 off the metered fare.

IMPORTANT DATES AND DISABLED VETERANS EXEMPTION UPDATE

2016 Calendar of important dates and timeframes for property tax related issues.

January through April

Make sure you are receiving all your property tax exemptions. Senior Citizen and Senior Freeze applications are sent out in January. The form for the Senior Exemption needs to be filed every year as does the Senior Citizen Freeze exemption form.

You are eligible for the Senior Citizen exemption if you were born in 1950 or earlier. First time applicants should stop by the Township Assessor's Office to fill out the proper forms.

To be eligible for the freeze your total household income must be less than \$55,000. In 2016 you are paying your 2015 taxes with the freeze based on your 2014 income.

February 1, 2016

The first installment tax bills are mailed out and are due March 1.

May through June

The Cook County Assessor property tax appeal process will be open. As of this writing, there is no exact date as appeal time varies slightly year to year. Residents are encouraged to sign up for the Township Assessor's email notification program. To be added to the program, send your email to: Dgamboa@palatinetownship.com.

July 1, 2016

The second installment of property tax bills is mailed out and is due on August 1.

September through October

The Board of Review property tax appeal process will open. Again, exact time varies year to year. Residents are encouraged to sign up for email notifications.

Disabled Veteran Exemption Expanded

The Disabled Veterans exemption has been expanded to allow for a partial property tax deduction for veterans with a service-related disability of 30%. Previously, the percent of service-related disability had to be at 50%. Disabled veterans are encouraged to call for the exact details and required forms.

TIRE AMNESTY

Tires are a staple of modern society, however they have become one of our largest solid waste headaches. This nuisance extends especially to our roadside ditches. Violators "fly dump" their unwanted tires, creating breeding grounds for mosquitoes, flooding and maintenance concerns for the Road District, not to mention an unsightly landscape. In response, we created a tire amnesty program several years ago and it has become a well-attended and anticipated event. Early each spring, on selected Saturdays, anyone living in Palatine Township can drop off their used tires at our yard. If you are a resident of Palatine Township, stop by and drop off your old tires at the Road District Garage, located at 530 N. Smith Street, Palatine. Once again centered around Earth Day, the tire amnesty

program will be from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM on Saturday April 16, 2016 and Saturday April 23, 2016. No tires over 16" in diameter or from commercial vendors will be accepted.



YARD WASTE PROGRAM AND COMPOST AVAILABILITY

Now that we can see an end to Winter 2015-2016 and all the shoveling that went with it, we can look forward to Spring and yard work! We will begin our annual yard waste



collection for the unincorporated areas on April 4, 2016 and will continue until November 22, 2016. Incorporated residents will need to check their Villages or City's vendor for their individual service dates. However, in late March and weather permitting, we will deliver 56 yard waste stickers to each household in the unincorporated areas. These stickers are to be used on your purchased yard waste bags for the following items: grass clippings, leaves, and garden debris. Dirt or sod is prohibited. Please do not put more than 40 pounds of material into the bags as they become too heavy to lift into our refuse truck. If you have small brush or branches, please tie them with twine in bundles 4 ft. or less in length and 2 ft. or less in diameter. By doing so, they will be more manageable for disposal. Additionally, for your gardening use, we have compost which is aged, ground yard waste and is offered for pick-up at the Road District Garage and Town Hall. Please call for availability, as this material is quickly consumed.

WATER QUALITY

We are fortunate to live near the Great Lakes, which is the largest group of fresh water lakes on the planet and represent 84% of North America's surface freshwater. Urban runoff is threatening these bodies of freshwater, and public awareness needs to be present and heightened. Urban runoff pollution comes from neighborhood streets, ditches, storm sewers, construction sites and parking lots. This runoff contains pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers from landscaped lawns and gardens, improper disposal of used oil and engine fluids into open lid manholes, and soil erosion from construction sites. Your support as residents of the community is essential to improve our water quality. Proper maintenance, responsible use of fertilizers, and correct waste disposal are just a few solutions to keep our creeks and streams clean. We must to do our part together to improve the water quality of our creeks and streams so we may continue living in a healthy ecosystem. Our local ecosystem is the Salt Creek Tributary, which starts mostly in Palatine Township and covers approximately 150 square miles. This watershed eventually makes its way into the Des Plaines River, then into the Illinois River and eventually to the Mississippi River. The flooding in the Southern States first started in our backyards. If we want to protect the Mississippi estuary, we must start in our own backyard.

This year, we increased our hours on Mondays to give increased access to the Township to those who work weekdays.
