questions to answer



I. MOVE QUESTIONS

1. Where do you want to go?
2. Why do you want to go there?
3. Have you ever been there before?
4. What would you like to see and do there?

II. LEARN QUESTIONS

1. What skill or craft do you want to learn?
2. Why do you want to learn this skill or craft?
3. Is it safe or dangerous? Expensive? Inexpensive?
4. What qualities does a person need to do this skill or craft?
5. Do you need special equipment or materials?
6. Share a video and/or photos of someone doing the skill or craft.

III. EAT QUESTIONS

1. What dishes is this place famous for?
2. Which local dishes do you want to eat? Have you tried them before?
3. What are some key local ingredients?
4. How is the food eaten (with a fork and knife? Chopstick? Fingers?)

AFTER YOU ANSWER YOUR QUESTIONS

After you have answered the move, eat, learn questions, you can prepare your presentation.

1. Find photographs on the internet.

2. Write your text. Your text can be from another source but please indicate the source. For example:

4. Michele will prepare the PowerPoint slides and send to you the final product for your feedback.

1. Michele will introduce you.
2. You will present your destination.
 - a. **Move.**
 - b. **Learn.**
 - c. **Eat.**



SOME PRESENTATION TIPS

Show, don't tell.

Here are some ideas to help you give **INTERESTING** and **interactive** presentations.

1. MAKE THE PARTICIPANTS GUESS THE DESTINATION

- SHOW A PHOTO
- SHARE A SONG
- SHARE A STORY
- SHOW THE MAP OF THE COUNTRY

2. SHOW A PHOTO OF A HANDICRAFT OR OF SOMEONE PERFORMING A SKILL.

3. Show photos of typical local foods and make the participants guess what kind of food they see.

4. Show a “fill in the blanks” recipe for a typical local dish.

5. End your presentation with a YOUTUBE video that represents your destination.

ATTENTION ALL PARTICIPANTS!

1. **Raise your hand to speak.**
2. **Write your questions in the text chat.**
3. Practice **active listening** (take notes and fully concentrate on what the speaker says).
4. **If you do not understand** something and need an explanation, raise your hand or write the word “*PARDON?*” or “*SORRY?*” in the text chat.
5. **At the end of each presentation**, Michele will choose **one person** to summarize what we learned.
