# **State Historic Park History**

Misión la Purisima Concepción de Maria Santísima (Mission of the Immaculate Conception of Most Holy Mary) was founded by Father Presidente Fermín de Lasuén on December 8. 1787. It was the 11th of 21 Franciscan Missions established in Alta California. A major earthquake on December 21, 1812 destroyed many of the mission buildings. In 1813 the mission community was relocated four miles to the northeast in "La Cañada de los Berros."

1834 marked the end of the California mission era when the Mexican government took away control of the missions from the Catholic Church authorities and gave it to civil authorities. The Mexican government sold La Purisima Mission to John Temple in 1845. In 1934 the Civilian Conservation Corps began the restoration project that would last 10 years.

Today, La Purisima Mission State Historic Park is the most fully restored mission in all of California with ten of the original buildings, furnished rooms, mission gardens and livestock to represent life at the mission during the 1820's.

### March 18 Traditional Mission Life Day

Join the costumed docents and staff for an opportunity to observe and participate in the craft activities that supplied the needs of the mission residents. Demonstrated crafts may include: tortilla making, candle making, soap making, spinning and weaving, carpentry, pottery, and blacksmithing.

#### April 22 Sheep Shear Mission Life Day

In addition to the traditional activities listed above you can watch our sheep get their annual shear and learn about wool production during the mission times with engaging activities for the entire family.

#### May 27 Hide & Tallow Mission Life Day

Come and trade with an American ship captain, observe and participate in traditional mission crafts along with other engaging activities for the entire family.

#### July 22 Children's Mission Life Day

Children's Mission Life in addition to activities mentioned will emphasize children's life at the mission, and other kid friendly activities.

### September 9 Harvest Mission Life Day

Come stomp grapes and trash wheat at the end of season harvest along with traditional activities listed above.

# Village Days August 26 & November 4 11:00 AM - 2:00 PM

The Tule Village comes to life as visitors experience the blending of traditional Chumash and Colonial Spanish life ways. Demonstrators help visitors learn a variety of skills such as grinding acorns, basket weaving, building a tule house, making soapstone beads or tule dolls, and playing Chumash games.

Buckskin clad members of the American Mountain Men share mountain men history and skills. Cooking, hide preparation and tanning, leather working, rope making, and blacksmithing are among the skills that visitors may experience.
