ANTIETAM By Rev. Jeff Miller

The Battle of Antietam, also known as the Battle of Sharpsburg, was fought on September 17, 1862, near Sharpsburg, Maryland. It was the first major battle in the War Between the States to take place on Union soil.....and it was the bloodiest single-day battle in American history, with about 23,000 casualties on both sides.

By September General George B. McClellan, commander of the Union Army had dogged The Army of Northern Virginia commanded by General Robert E. Lee into Maryland. McClellan took up a defensive position behind Antietam Creek located about 4 miles outside of the town of Sharpsburg.

At dawn on September 17, Gen. Joseph Hooker's corps mounted a powerful assault on Lee's left flank. Attacks and counterattacks swept across Miller's cornfield and fighting swirled around the Dunker Church. Yankee assaults against the Sunken Road eventually pierced the Confederate center. In the afternoon, Gen. Ambrose Burnside's corps entered the action, capturing a stone bridge over Antietam Creek and advancing against the Confederate right. At a crucial moment, Gen. A.P. Hill's division arrived from Harpers Ferry and launched a surprise counterattack, driving back Burnside and ending the battle.

McClellan failed to destroy Lee's army. However, Lee's invasion of Maryland ended, and he was able to withdraw his army back to Virginia without interference from the cautious McClellan. Although the battle was basically a draw it was enough to give Lincoln the confidence to announce his Emancipation Proclamation, which discouraged the British and French governments from potential plans for recognition of the Confederacy.

The Reverend Jeffrey Miller is the Rector of the Parish Church of St. Helena in Beaufort, SC. A native of Pennsylvania, Reverend Miller holds a BA (cum laude) degree in History from the Indiana University of Pennsylvania and MDiv (Master in Divinity) degree from Virginia Theological Seminary. Prior to entering the ministry, Reverend Miller was employed by the National Park Service and his last duty station was at Antietam National Battlefield. He is a life-long student of the American Civil War.

ANNOUNCING AN EXCLUSIVE LCWRT TOUR OF THE H.L. HUNLEY SUBMARINE

The saga of the Confederate submarine, the *H. L. Hunley*, is one of the most fascinating in the Civil War. Though it played a minor role in the War, it looms large in the history of naval warfare. It was the first combat submarine to sink an enemy warship, the Union sloop *USS Housatonic*, which was on blockade duty in Charleston harbor. It's raising and recovery in August of 2000 is one of the great success stories of marine archaeology.

I am delighted to announce to our members the Lowcountry Civil War Round Table is organizing a guided tour of the *Hunley* and a tour of the Charleston Museum's exhibit, *City Under Siege: Charleston in the Civil War*, on March 6, 2013. This tour is being organized exclusively for Roundtable members, and the \$115 dollar fee will include:

- Transportation aboard a luxury motor coach, all entrance fees, lunch and driver's tip included.
- Guided tour of the H. L. Hunley submerged in a 900,000 gallon conservation tank, Hunley exhibit and conservation lab, Charleston, South Carolina
- Guided tour of the exhibition at the Charleston Museum, *City Under Siege: Charleston in the Civil War--* an overview of the events in and around Charleston from secession to 1865, including the Federal naval blockade, Union bombardments and five major Union attempts to capture the city.
- Lunch at the Charleston Restaurant 39 Rue de Jean.
