Engage for a day with this ancient path of the Céile Dé, the oldest continuous spiritual lineage of the Celtic countries, seamlessly weaving together love of God, reverence for nature, and a deep desire to unite the two in Christ.

Sue Mosher, an ordained teacher in the Céile Dé tradition, will offer an experiential introduction to the tradition’s philosophy and its application in everyday modern life, including:

- ⊕ Observing the ancient holy days of the Gael
- ⊕ Learning about a way of life that supports real personal transformation
