NOTES

Overview - homicide incidents may involve both multiple victims and multiple offenders.

A number of rules were applied to incident based tables. The primary relationship between any two parties in an incident was identified as the closest relationship. Therefore incidents involving the death of, for example, an intimate partner and a child are intimate partner incidents.

There were a total of 65 deaths in 2010/12 where the victim was aged under 18.

Of this total, 43 victims were killed by family members (66%), 16 victims were killed by non-family members (25%) and for 6 victims no relationship between victim and offender was recorded (9%).
