I was proud that Pilgrim had one of the largest delegations, and I was inspired by the speakers, workshops, and the mission project that united the adults, young adults, and youth. Next year the meeting will be in San Diego. If you have never attended a meeting, I believe you would be blessed.

The next Church Council meeting will be Wednesday, September 6. Remember anyone is welcome to attend, and you will get a better idea of the work that goes on "behind the scenes" to continue the church's ministry to our community and the world.

thoughtful words and prayer





Good news Pilgrims! We have \$12 any day tickets for the L. A. County which begins on Labor Day weekend. Their theme this year is DARE TO FAIR







SAFETY TIP

How often have you backed out of a parking spot, just to have another car start to pull out at the same time, someone with a shopping cart start walking behind you (which you can't see until you have backed up enough to see past the car you're parked next to), or a car looking for a spot to park drive behind you? LOTS

If while pushing your cart through the parking lot, driving in the parking lot, or pulling out of a spot. Would it help if you could see a car before it started to move when you are looking in your mirror or driving through the lot. Would it help if you had a heads up that a car was going to start moving out of a parking space. Of course it would.

After going through this for years and watching accidents happen and almost hits I started turning on my emergency blinkers on just after turning the engine on and putting the car in reverse. I have found it is not hard to do and maybe the car across from me could see in his mirror that I was making a move, someone walking to there car could see a warning ahead that I was starting to back out and that person looking for a spot to park would stop in time to let me out safely.

If this e-mail makes sense to you and you think it would be a way to make parking lots safer, please put this into your daily routine and keep this e-mail going so we all can make our busy parking lot's safer.
