# Reflection

Dr. Beth Bingham ~ Senior Minister

Sometimes it is called the "Stewardship Drive," sometimes a "Pledge Drive." It is the time in the life of the church when we are asked to decide how much we can give to the church in the coming year.

But for some years now at Pilgrim we instead have "Consecration Sunday." I like that, for it means that we are asked to prayerfully consider not only our financial gifts, but also our times of time and service and love to the church. We are asked to prayerfully consider the blessings that we have received and to make our gifts as gestures of gratitude and thanks. In those moments we also, I think, measure our faith in the God who has so richly given to each of us

November is such a perfect time for us to consecrate ourselves and our gifts. For it was in November of 1620 that the Pilgrims, our spiritual ancestors, landed in the new world. And lives and faith of those Pilgrims might inspire us —the pilgrims of Pilgrim Congregational Church.

We know their story well. They crossed the Atlantic Ocean in the midst of the wild autumn weather which meant that they were enough off course that they landed on Cape Cod instead of in Virginia. After choosing what is now Plymouth as the place where they would settle had to live on the ship while their first buildings were constructed. The winter was so long and harsh that half of them had died by spring.

But none of them took up the captain's offer to ride the Mayflower back home to England. They had left because they needed the freedom to

know God and worship God as they felt the Scriptures revealed to them. They built homes with the knowledge and help of the natives; they learned how to plant and harvest. And despite the hardships their faith never flagged. They knew that God was with them through even the roughest moments of their journey and in the daily struggles of surviving in a unfamiliar land.

So it is that sometimes in these days it seems as if we too are negotiating rough waters. We too have daily struggles surviving in or living in a world often feels unfamiliar. Yet God is closest to us when we open our hearts and let God into our lives. God is nearest to us, when we share our faith in God with others who are also looking for light in the shadows of their lives. God is dearest to us when we feel the closeness and affection and deep care of those who gather around us as we worship together, as we pray together, and yes even as we play together.

So let our Thanksgiving celebrations begin today and continue tomorrow and for all the days ahead. Let us join those brave Pilgrims who landed 397 years ago who lived by the words of Pastor John Robinson who sent them on their way to a new life in a new world: "The Lord hath more truth and light to break forth out of His Holy Word."


