We make commitments of faith to support the work of God.

There will also be something significant to remember and celebrate. The Reverend Dr. Beth Bingham gave her first official sermon as pastor of Pilgrim Congregational Church on Sunday, January 10, 1993. On Sunday, January 14, we will be marking her twenty-fifth anniversary as Pastor. We are grateful for her impact on us—helping us feel welcomed, loved, and challenged by thought-provoking sermons and worship experiences. I have been a pastor, and I know that it is not always easy.
