# WHERE TO BEGIN... August 17, 2016

The sun is shining now after another night of rain. The full moon was still breaking through the gathering clouds when I went to bed last night, but the clouds prevailed. This morning late summer is in full display: steamy, blowsy, fickle—pouring down hot sun, then a sudden shower. And that sun sets a little earlier each day.

"Don't let summer slip away..." the UUA bookstore urges this morning in my email. And exactly how would I prevent that? The slipping away of summer is what always happens at the end of August. After everything starts up again in September, we'll have warm days and call them Indian summer, but the jig is up. The Earth is turning. We are on the move.

I remember this summer: the peonies and lilacs, the ripening of roadside raspberries, the rise of the sunflowers and the corn. Now goldenrod is blooming, and the geese are beginning to gather. Everything is in transition again. This is the way of the world: always changing, always going somewhere else.

The Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Rockland is in transition too. Once more a new minister has come to serve you. Once more the work of learning each other, the questions, the wariness that accompanies change.

The early days of a new ministry are sometimes called "the honeymoon period." People are relieved to have the waiting over with and excited about getting to know their new minister. The thing is: saving the day is something we do together.

A delegation of adults and youth was preparing to go to South America for a service project. The congregation had just

successfully completed a major capital campaign to raise money for another Religious Educator on the staff. "This is great!" I said. "Tell me how to find a congregation like this one."

My colleague smiled, and then he said gently, "But, Dawn, this wasn't here when I got here. The congregation and I have spent the last ten years making this happen together. You don't just walk into a congregation like this one. You and the congregation have to create it." Oh.

Well, let the creation begin.
