THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD: FEB. 2

On Feb. 2, 40 days after Christmas, we celebrate the presentation of our Lord at the temple. He was received by Simeon, a prophet and scholar of great age. Simeon had prayed to live to see the Messiah and, as his desire was fulfilled, he prayed: "Lord, now let Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word; for my eyes have seen Your salvation which You have prepared in the presence of all people, a light to enlighten the Gentiles and glory for Your people Israel."

Your Communications Committee, having designed and completed the superb brochure and other printed material you received before the holidays, has now begun to focus on our website which already has some links to the building project, but soon will be a source of much more information. When we commence construction, updates will be available and we plan to install several webcams, enabling you to log in and view construction progress. Valentine's Day Craft Idea: Teaching God's Love

THE PROPHET ZACHARIAH Commemorated February 8



In the history of the Jewish people, decades and generations were spent in captivity by the Babylonians. The Prophet Zachariah was born in Babylon during the close of the captivity and spent the last years of his life in Judah, prophecizing, teaching and helping rebuild the temple in Jerusalem. His name means "he whom God remembers." His prophecies not only foretold immediate events in the lives of his

people, but also of Christ: His coming in humility, his rejection and betrayal, His reign, and establishment of peace.

Making it real. We often overlook prophetic books from the Old Testament. Perhaps they seem too long and difficult—or just seem irrelevant. If we take the time, though, to read the 6 or 7 pages of the Book of Zachariah, we'll quickly come to realize just how accessible, powerful and relevant the prophets are. Line after poetic line speaks of the importance of God in our lives: as moral compass, as compassionate Father, as hope of the hopeless, as loving Savior. Read his book and isolate a few brief, favorite quotes; then post them on your refrigerator. They'll help you, and your children and grandchildren, commit holy scripture to memory, as well as offer inspiration and strength throughout the day.



February's National Philoptochos Society Commitment:

Autism Assistance Fund: Autism is a complex, life-long, neurological disorder that inhibits a person's ability to communicate and develop social relationships, and this disorder is diagnosed in one out of 150 children in the United States. Only six states mandate that the costs associated with the treatment and therapy of autism spectrum disorders be covered by health care insurance, leaving families to individually address devastating financial burdens. This fund will heighten awareness of autism and provide assistance and support to persons within the autism spectrum.



St. Photios Shrine: In 1965, the Archdiocese purchased the Avero house in historic Saint Augustine, Florida to commemorate the arrival of the first Greek set-tlers to the New World in 1768. The Philoptochos has continued to provide financial assistance towards the preservation of this national shrine.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

Our 2010 Stewardship numbers are still being tallied but as of mid January, we finished the year with total collections of \$475,137. In addition, we received \$17,871 from our Thanksgiving appeal. While this is slightly below last year's figures, we are ahead of where we finished in 2008. A flurry of last minute donations at the end of December came in via check, credit card and online donations. We thank our Stewards who responded to our Thanksgiving appeal which helped close our financial gap.
