Dear Parishioners,

As we approach the most profound period of our Lord's life, our thoughts and hearts turn Godward. THE DARKENED CHURCH

Just before midnight on Holy Saturday Night, the lights go out. The Church gradually sinks into total darkness, symbolizing...

The darkness of the grave The darkness of life without God The darkness of despair The darkness of meaninglessness

This is the darkness in which we stand, the darkness within and around us. We are—all of us—
threatened by this darkness.

But the glorious message of Pascha is that Christ is greater than the darkness. The darkness cannot last for long, in our hearts, because Christ has come, the light within us: "In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it" (John 1:4).

This is the message we will hear proclaimed in the Gospel at the Resurrection Service, and this is the heart of our Orthodox Christian Faith. Kalo Pascha!

Speaking of harmony, Themeli has all the important traits of an extremely strong CM, and they also share with our architect, Yervant Nahikian, a reverence for the special undertaking of building our new place of worship.

Over thirty parishioners attended the Zoning Board of Appeals hearing where our right to build our dome to the design height of 64' was affirmed unanimously by the ZBA. We are grateful to these vigilant stewards of our Church for being there and showing their support.

We are fast approaching \$3.7 million in pledges with almost \$2 million collected, and we continue to reach out to all our parishioners to participate in this once-in-a-lifetime project to realize our common dream and the mandate of the General Assembly.


The Ground Breaking Ceremony will take place after the Divine Liturgy on May 15! We are grateful to have His Eminence Metropolitan Methodios join us on this memorable day, when we will mark the beginning of a new phase of our development. Please mark your calendars, rain or shine: we want everyone in the pictures, for history is going to be made on this day.

Very soon, we will see some significant activity relative to the commencement of construction: temporary storage containers will begin arriving on site; the preparation of the temporary worship space in the all-purpose building will commence; and you will receive notice of the Last Liturgy to be celebrated in our existing sanctuary (the following week, we will begin to worship in the temporary space—and this will continue for approximately one year—as construction will begin on our new building).

Stay in touch by reading updates in *The Vine*, and very soon you will be notified about the launch of a new webpage, a sister-page to our Churchsite, which will be devoted to information on the construction project, including project updates, webcams focused on the construction in progress, and much more.



THE MEANING OF PALM SUNDAY



"The Liturgy of Palm Sunday commemorates the triumphant entry of Christ into Jerusalem. With palm branches in our hands, we identify ourselves with the people of Jerusalem. Together with them we greet the King, singing 'Hosannah' to Him. But what is the meaning of this today for us? First, it is our confession of Christ as our King and Lord. We forget so often that the Kingdom of God has already been inaugurated and that on the day of our Baptism, we were made citizens of this kingdom and pledged our loyalty to it, above all other loyalties....

The branches in our hands signify ... our readiness and willingness to follow Him on His sacrificial way and our acceptance of sacrifice and self-denial as the only royal way to the Kingdom. And finally these branches, this celebration, proclaim our faith in the final victory of Christ. His Kingdom is yet hidden and the world ignores it. It lives as if the decisive event had not taken place, as if God had not died on the Cross and Man in Him was not raised from the dead. But we, Orthodox Christians, believe in the coming of the Kingdom in which God will be all in all—and Christ the only King." ARCHITECTURE OF FAITH: THE GOSPEL BOOK



Within church "architecture," there are few items as powerful or sacred to us as the Gospel Book. Within it we find our holy Sunday and feastday readings, from the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. And within

it, we find the precepts of salvation: the compassion, healing, love and promise of our Lord. Whenever a deacon, priest or bishop opens the Gospel and reads to us, God is speaking to His people. This is also true, whenever we open our Bibles at home and read with an open heart. When it is not being read from or processed with, the Gospel Book ("Evangelion" or "Good News") is enthroned on the Holy Altar. The guilded covers are notable as well: one side depicts the Resurrection, and this side always faces up/toward the people on Sundays, as well as during the Easter period; the other shows the Crucifixion and faces up during the rest of the week. This most holy of books is the center of our life at St. Demetrios.
