Dear Parishioners,

"ÇHRISTOS ANESTI!"

The following is an excerpt from the Paschal message given on Holy Saturday Night before the Resurrection Service. I offer it to you along with the invitation to join us for the Groundbreaking Ceremony on May 15th following the Divine Liturgy.

"This is a special year for our St. Demetrios community. A sad and joyous occasion at the same time as we celebrate our last Holy Week in this sanctuary and look forward to our new Church edifice. An overwhelming decision, as you know, was made two years ago to build a new sanctuary on this very site where our present Church stands that will ensure for all of us and our children the "Building on our Faith." The groundbreaking event to mark the construction of our new Church, and the preparation of a tempo-

rary sanctuary now underway in our hall, will be held on Sunday, May 15th, just three short weeks from now. I hope you will be here to both remember and celebrate what St. Demetrios means to so many of us. We are building on the faith of our fathers and mothers, our founders, and all who have and do dream and envision even a brighter and greater "faith future," for those who will follow 25, 50, and even 100 years from now. I invite you to become part of this timeless legacy—to leave behind something beautiful to our children and grandchildren—to remind them of our deep commitment and faith and to safeguard our Orthodox heritage and tradition for them. There is nothing greater we can leave to future generations than our faith and values which will enrich their lives and keep the light—the unwaning light of Christ lit in their hearts. Join us in support and help us build our new Church together.

Let tonight's occasion and joyful message of hope in the Resurrected Lord inspire each of us to fully love, to serve one another unselfishly in Christ's name, and to live more fully, bathing in the unwaining light that only Christ can bring to each troubled heart and broken world through His Resurrection! Forgive one another, return to Christ if you have drifted away and accept the love that He offers from a now empty tomb—and from the fact, fully realized, that He wills to live and dwell in every grateful believing heart now and always."

Again, I wish you, during this period of renewal and joy, a post-Paschal period filled with our Risen Lord's blessings and hopeful promises for a full life in Christ. Please join us on May 15th for what promises to be a historic day at our Groundbreaking.

Although photos plus an HD video of the event will become part of our growing archive of milestones, and several YouTube clips will appear online, nothing will compare with your actual participation in a history-making event.

Many milestones have been achieved along the way to this moment: a large, incredibly talented and dedicated team of volunteer parishioners has come forth; \$4.2 million, or over two thirds of the \$6.2 million project cost, has been pledged; \$2 million has been donated; a beautiful design has been completed; a construction manager worthy of this sacred task has been engaged; all necessary public entitlements have been obtained; construction financing has been arranged and approved; the movement in one short week of our worship space has been planned; our icons and mosaics will be preserved and properly stored; a new link to our Church's website (go to www.stdemetriosweston.org and click on "Building on Our Faith") has been created to inform the whole parish, and the world, of our project's history and its progress; 4 webcams will be installed so each of you can personally monitor the construction's progress; and much, much more.

In achieving each of these milestones and more, the volunteers continue to dedicate thousands of hours of their valuable time and skills. This project is a reflection of the parish itself. No one person or group could possibly make this happen. Only when we have an overwhelming mandate, a large group of volunteers, the love and support of all our parishioners and, importantly, the smart, inspired leadership of our clergy, can such an undertaking succeed. This can only mean our project is blessed. And this is worthy of a great celebration. See you at the groundbreaking!

SAINTLY LIVES



STS. MARY AND MARTHA Commemorated June 4

Mary and Martha, together with their brother Lazarus, were especially devoted to Jesus. After Lazarus' resurrection from the dead (remember this past Saturday of Lazarus, which is the Saturday before Palm Sunday each year), they went to Cyprus, where Lazarus became the first Bishop of Kition. One of the most powerful lessons from their holy lives is found in Luke 10:38-42. Here, the Lord has come to see Martha, Mary and Lazarus at their home. While the Lord

is teaching, Mary is sitting at His feet, with the rest, while He shares beautiful words of hope, forgiveness and salvation with all present. We are told that Martha, though, is very busy serving everyone, probably the modern equivalent of making sure everyone has a snack and doing housework: "...Martha was distracted with much serving." She becomes frustrated and asks the Lord to direct Mary to help her and stop "just listening." Jesus instead tells Martha to seek holy priorities in her life: "... you are anxious and troubled about many things; one thing is needful. Mary has chosen the good portion, which shall not be taken away from her." In the end, Jesus teaches Martha that nothing is more vital than His Gospel. When the Lord speaks to us, we have to remember that everything else can wait!

Getting Practical. Are you a "Martha" or a "Mary"? All of us probably have traits of both. What can we do to remind ourselves, and our children, to make Christ the center of our lives and attention? One easy, every-day thing we can do is to pray before meals, if we don't already. When we stop our serving, pause before eating, and give thanks to God, we send a clear message to our families: our relationship with Christ deserves time and full attention. Everything else can wait!



STEWARDSHIP

Have you made your 2011 Pledge yet? If not, why? If not now, when?

As we approach the mid-year point, please check to see that you have made a pledge for 2011. Believe it or not, many stewards have not filled out a pledge card yet. While we are ahead of where we were last year, we are not close to getting 100% participation with pledges. I often wonder why: (1) some people do not fill out pledge cards, and (2) others wait until the end of the year to submit their pledge.

I'm not sure why there is reluctance to make a pledge to our Church or why we would not make regular contributions toward our pledge throughout the year. Like any organization, the Church has a budget with expenses that are paid during the year. We cannot wait until December to pay our bills. Consequently, it makes it very difficult to budget if we don't know what is coming in during the ecclesiastical year. Do we wait until the end of the year and see "what is left over" before making a gift to the Church? Is the Church the place to put our "leftovers"?

We make it very easy to work with us by: (1) making regular contributions via the envelopes that we mail at the beginning of the year; (2) stopping by the office to contribute via credit card; or (3) going online to our website at **www.stdemetriosweston.**org and making an online contribution, either a one-time payment or recurring contribution. Many stewards are taking advantage of the latter, which provides for a simple way to make payments toward your pledge. It's free and easy.

So far, we have received 341 pledges totaling \$333,266 and \$29,332 in non-pledged contributions. Our budget for the year is over \$500,000 so we have a long way to go.

Don't forget to come to our upcoming wine tasting scheduled for May 14 at 6:30 pm. The fall event was a great success and enjoyed by all who came. Please join us and sample some excellent international wines as well as a selection of Greek foods. Wines will be available for ordering and delivery. There will be separate activities for kids so please feel free to bring your children. Our sommelier is well known in the Boston restaurant trade and promises to bring some fantastic selections for your tasting pleasure.


