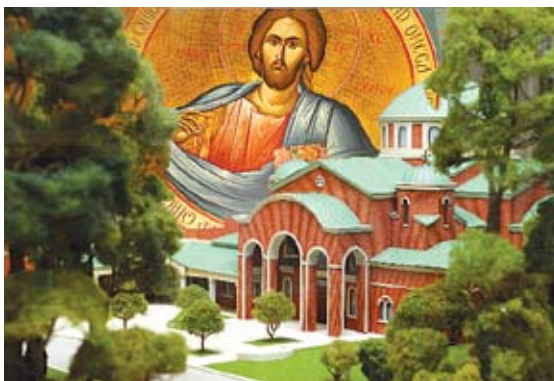

BUILDING ON OUR FAITH: THE MOVE

June 19 was an emotional day for many who attended our last Divine Liturgy in the sanctuary that has served our growing parish so well for over 40 years. For many of us the space we have all called home evokes the memories of a christening, wedding, funeral, graduation, and a quiet prayer, so many of the

most important moments in our lives. These memories are mine as well.

I have written that it is the hope for a bright future that inspired our parents and grandparents, the founders of St. Demetrios, to meet the challenges they faced in acquiring and building in Newton Lower Falls and then again on

Brown Street in Weston. This same aspiration has inspired our whole parish to once again call out for a new sanctuary that will fulfill our sacraments and quiet prayers for the years to come. The entire Building Committee does find great strength in this, more than enough to meet each challenge set by our General Assembly in May of 2009.

You may be surprised to learn that it was not a construction or moving crew who moved our place of worship in one week from the date of our last Liturgy on the 19th to the first celebration on Sunday, June 26—it was your fellow parishioners in a well orchestrated dance planned by a subcommittee called the Transition Committee. St. Demetrios wants to thank Chair Peter Paravalos, Charles Theodore, George Sgourakes, Joseph Santangelo, John Morakis, and the whole Committee for a masterful job! Not only was our place of worship for the next year and a half moved, but so were our offices and more. Many items have been put into storage awaiting the opening of the doors of our new parish in 18 months—or less!

Nothing speaks more about the talent and dedication completely devoted to our Building on our Faith project than the way this move was planned, managed and executed. Although in the last couple of weeks our parish has secured its Building Permit for the work soon to commence, and it has closed on the construction financing authorized by our General Assembly, and will soon have completed the bidding of the subcontractors for the construction project—nothing causes me more personal pride than to see so many volunteers grasp instantly the plans and preparations established by the Transition Committee, roll up their sleeves and successfully complete our move.

SAINTLY LIVES

REPOSE OF ST. ANNA, MOTHER OF THE THEOTOKOS Commemorated July 25



Our Church teaches that although St. Anna and St. Joachim, her husband, wanted a baby, they remained without children until old age. With sorrow but also great hope, they prayed to God for a child—and if He were to grant this, that the baby would be offered to Him as a gift. The Lord heard their supplication and, through an angelic visit, informed them of the birth of their daughter, the Virgin Mary. God kept His promise: soon-after, Anna conceived a child. She and Joachim kept their promise as well, as they offered the life of their newborn

to God with tremendous faith and thanksgiving.

Making it real. Sometimes it seems as if God is not hearing our prayers—if nothing else, sometimes it seems like He's at least not answering them. God's sense of timing and our sense of timing are often different. This can be frustrating, and sometimes we all feel like we might as well stop hoping. Use the example of Joachim and Anna to spark a discussion about this issue with your son or daughter. Concentrate on these important points: (a) prayer is not about "getting" or "give/take" but about creating a relationship with God; and (b) have patience, trusting that the Lord hears us, loves us, cares about us, and will bless us in His own way—and in His own time. What we "get" may not be what we expected or thought we wanted, but we will always receive exactly what we need.

IOCC Update: Spring Tornado Support

International Orthodox Christian Charities is a pan-Orthodox philanthropic institution, dedicated to relieving suffering, hunger and homelessness throughout the world—and giving “hands and feet” to our faith.

Here, IOCC’s executive director highlights recent efforts following the devastating tornado season, and reminds us just how important it is to back up our prayer life with practice and holy action. Perhaps this summer, we too can support the ministry of IOCC or a local helping organization and strive to emulate our Lord through hands-on commitment and compassionate works.

“What would you do if you only had a few minutes warning before disaster struck? Gather your family? Grab your valuables? Or just find a safe place to take shelter? Those were the split second, life changing decisions that faced the tornado victims in Joplin, Missouri, Tuscaloosa, Alabama and Springfield, Massachusetts. The spring of 2011 will go down in US history as one of the most devastating tornado seasons ever, and a sobering reminder that we must be ever vigilant and ever prepared. IOCC has trained 60 Orthodox clergy and lay persons in the U.S. in disaster preparedness and emergency management. They now form the backbone of the Emergency Response Network and have the concrete skills needed to deal with communities and parishioners in times

of crisis, such as the 2011 tornadoes that have killed more than 500 people and left thousands more homeless. When tornadoes struck Alabama in April, Deacon Daniel Gray, a retired Naval Commander from Eagle River, Alaska, was immediately dispatched there and began working with local Orthodox Christian parishes to assess the damage and provide pastoral care to survivors in the rural towns of northeastern Alabama. Marsha, a Tuscaloosa resident, had never heard of the Orthodox Christian Church before the disaster but was thankful for all of the personal hygiene items, tents, air mattresses and flashlights provided by IOCC as well as the pastoral support from our frontliner. “Deacon Dan was like the image of Christ’s love amidst all of the wreckage,” she recalls. Responding quickly to victims of disaster with emergency relief and short-term recovery is at the heart of IOCC’s mission and what we strive for whenever called upon, by God’s grace, without discrimination. We could not do it, however, without the generous and ongoing support of our donors who make the resources available to us when needed, or without the members of our Emergency Response Network who have been specially trained to rise to the challenges that disaster leaves in its wake. To you, our supporters, and to our frontliners, we say “thank you.”

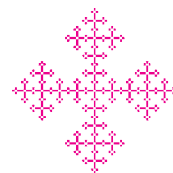
