FR. NICK'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

As a new ecclesiastical year begins I welcome you back from a well deserved respite where hopefully you have spent some quality time with family and friends. It is during such quieter and less hectic times that we also reflect on the purpose and meaning of our lives i.e. our spiritual journey. Much is made these days about being spiritual as if spirituality is a condition foreign to our everyday life. It is not! If we only look closely at the life of Christ we will see that the spiritual life is not to be found somewhere else but here and now in the place where we live and interact with everyday existence. Christ did that by encountering the joys and sorrows in His life and in the lives of others that he met along the way as we also must.

I believe that we have the notion today that spirituality is highly personal and individual and therefore should be pursued independent of anything and everything else. Being spiritual is such a lofty goal that those who undertake the journey do not realize that the very good things we wish to taste and see, also have destructive elements that often cannot be discerned without direction and help. The great spiritual sages and saints from all traditions but especially our Orthodox Christian roots warn us about going it alone and advise us to look to those who humbly have traveled the path before us.

Just citing one example that of prayer. We know this is a central way to develop a relationship with God. Yet the many movements, groups, self help books and yes even well meaning "gurus" of our day prove that such experimentation can sometimes do more harm than good. Spiritual direction and formation is about preparation, discipline, listening, among others, that is informed by faith. If prayer, for instance, is to be that authentic encounter with the living God we must first realize how ill prepared we are to undertake the journey within as God's Spirit is a powerful force that asks for all our undivided attention. On the other hand those who avoid entering into such a place and a meaningful relationship with God or any relationship will not experience the fullness and fruits of the spiritual life but are destined to only live externally, superficially and rather boring lives.

My hope and prayer is to invite you to participate more fully in the life of Christ and His Church. We always look for ways to make your church experience at St. Demetrios more comfortable and perhaps even easy. I am not sure that this is in your best interest for the way to live fully and authentically, the Christian Life is simply not easy. Christ spoke of that journey being difficult and the gate being narrow and certainly perilous as we have seen from His sacred life. The question is how much do we desire to know God, to be with Him and if so how open are we to do His Will and even be led to places and circumstances we would rather not go? (John 21:18)

Join us and let's make the commitment together to see where the Spirit of God will lead us on this spiritual awesome journey.



NATIVITY OF THE THEOTOKOS

We hope you will join us on September 8, as we commemo-



rate this truly joyous feast of our Church. The birth of the Virgin Mary marks a special moment in our spiritual history: the coming into the worldthrough her parents Joachim and Anna- of the amazing woman who would play such a vital role in Christ coming into the world. She is our

greatest saint, and her life reminds us of the importance of being obedient to the Holy Spirit and our own consciences. Despite her personal worries and concerns, it was her willingness to trust in God's plan that led to the birth of Christ, the great key to our salvation.

THE CROSS

For over 1900 years the cross has been a beloved symbol for the believing Christian. We view the cross in two ways. It is, first of all, a sign of Christ's love for us, for it reveals the extent of his suffering and the stark reality of death for our sakes. St Paul speaks of Jesus humbling himself: "...and (He) became obedient



unto death, even the death of the cross." This is to say, Christ accepted the most extreme form of suffering and death. Could there be a greater display of love and sacrifice than to live for man and then die for him by Crucifixion?

In the ancient world, crucifixion was the most horrible form of capital punishment; it was used only for the worst criminals. Who can describe the physical pain of hanging on the cross? Who can describe the spiritual pain in those darkest hours? It is no wonder that, upon the cross, He cried out to His Father, "My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?"

The Cross is, secondly, intimately connected to our own lives. Orthodox Christians must never associate the cross only with Christ, for there is a cross for every believer in the Lord. "Whosoever will come after Me," Christ said, "let him take up his cross, and deny himself and follow Me." So, there is a cross for each of us.

Now it is one thing to glorify and praise the cross as a symbol of Christ's great love and devotion, but it is another thing to accept the cross as central to our daily lives. This is precisely what the cross must be for us — a way of life. For us, to come into the world and be baptized is to become a cross-bearer.

EUPHROSYNOS THE COOK, COMMEMORATED SEPT. 11



St. Euphrosynos lived as an ordinary monk in the 9th century and was very simple and faithful, humbly serving as the cook of the monastery in which he lived. One night the spiritual father of that monastery dreamt that he was in Paradise where he was surprised to see St. Euphrosynos, who gave him three beautiful apples from a tree there. When he awoke, he saw the three apples lying on his pillow much to his amazement. They were very

fragrant. Rushing to St. Euphrosynos, he asked him where he had been last night, and the saint said, "where you were, Father." Before this, no one had paid attention or given respect to the cook in that monastery, but often the opposite. When the spiritual father told the other monks about the holiness of St. Euphrosynos, which he had just discovered, St. Euphrosynos fled the monastery into the desert for the rest of his life, fearing the praise of men. May this humble servant of God teach us by his example and by his prayers to seek the Heavenly Kingdom first, and live humbly serving our brothers or sisters gladly, until Heavenly fruit grows in us. St. Euphrosynos is the patron saint of chefs and cooks.
