FR. NICK'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

During the past few months I have been writing to you about our journey through life and asking that we not neglect to make it a spiritual journey. Last month, the emphasis was on developing an **authentic spirituality** which may be difficult to discern in our day because many paths promise such a **spirituality**. Today, as the author Stacy Kaiser has observed in her book, **How to Be a Grown Up**, "... people are inclined to discover and figure out their own values and beliefs... (this) spiritual route allows someone to follow their own path... that's what our generation is seeking."

When one observes closely this line of thinking, we witness the devastating results and confusion that comes when people make up their own rules as they go. God no longer is necessary it seems nor any principles higher than the ones individuals choose to follow. It was for this reason that we spoke in the last Vine and offered an invitation to discover the **Living God** and His truth that is contained in **His Word- The Bible**. This cannot be accomplished unless there is a desire, an openness for **God's Word** and how that **Word** can speak to **me** directly. This journey begins with a desire for a true relationship between God and us, to develop, based on faith, trust and reverence. There is a two thousand year history of spiritual direction that is founded on scripture and our Lord's life.

In our Orthodox Church true and authentic spirituality has some very important ingredients. One of these as an example, is **silence**. If our hearts and minds are filled with anxious words and thoughts, there will be no space for God's word to be heard and enter our hearts. In our world, silence is not easy to acquire and if we try to achieve this inner focus without guidance, we will discover that there will be competing thoughts and experiences as we enter this **inner realm**. Which thoughts, images and desires do we trust and which take us away from the path that leads to God?

One other example calls for us to develop a relationship with a spiritual father who is not a guru, telling us what to do and when. Rather, a spiritual father, is someone who will standby us, who will listen and come to know us, who has travelled the road before and is aware of the pitfalls and illusions found along the path. Such spiritual guidance comes from the collective wisdom of countless witnesses who lived and experienced the truth that can only be found in Christ and His Church. The church contains not only the wisdom of the ages but the Spirit of God that descends on those who call Christ Savior and Lord.

Trusting and building a relationship is often hard to find and even more difficult to maintain especially when the world's appetite for power, glory and control is so dominant. Yet, such possibilities do exist today within the Christian Community. Without it, we can easily perish in a sea of self-indulgence and egocentricity. Finding spiritual guidance that relies on the **faith of our fathers** can be a **pearl of great price** that can bring us in communion with God and His people. Discover what and how a community of faith can mean to you and your loved ones. Join us here at St. Demetrios and make it part of your faith journey.

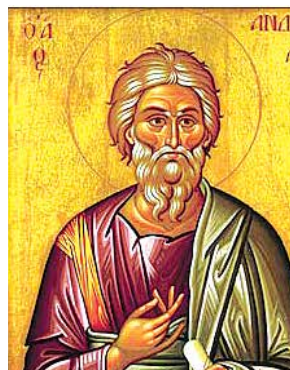

ST. ANDREW THE APOSTLE COMMEMORATED NOVEMBER 30



Born in Bethsaida, St. Andrew was a fisherman by trade. He became a dedicated disciple of John the Baptist and then, following his baptism, left him to become the first Apostle of Jesus Christ. He also brought along his brother, Peter.

Both are numbered among the Twelve Great Apostles. After Pentecost, St. Andrew was chosen to preach in a host of lands- including Byzantium, Thrace, Peloponnese, Epirus, Georgia and Kiev. He was martyred in the Peloponnese, in the city of Patras, 62 AD

- He is the patron saint of several countries, including Romania and Scotland.
- His feast day is also the name day of our Boston Metropolis.
- Patriarch Bartholomew is considered the spiritual successor of St. Andrew.

BUILDING ON OUR FAITH

A WONDERFUL OCTOBER

What a wonderful Sunday October 18th was! We celebrated liturgy for the first time with the complete set of furnishings in our narthex now that the beautiful pangaria have arrived and are installed; celebrated the blessing of the five loaves, adjourned to coffee hour, and hosted

our General Assembly. All these were attended by large numbers of faithful.

Some installation work remains in the narthex area. Doors need to be installed behind the pangaria and to the

sides of the Proskinitaria or candle stands. Mosaics will be substituted for the temporary printed art in each of the fixtures. These are unique sizes in each panel and are currently being completed by our designer in their studios in Newton, Massachusetts. I think we can all agree that each and every piece is extraordinary and an unbelievable value for the amount donated to build each.

Starting to take shape and also visible on the 18th is our stunning iconostasios. The heavy marble bases are installed and the columns, the largest of which weigh almost 1,800 lbs., are being installed presently. The arches for both the center royal gate area and the smaller ones over each of the six icons have also been delivered and installation is ongoing. The center arch, now being reinforced with steel weighs 2,600 lbs.! The small ones are 800 lbs. each. This installation is a fantastic feat and the results will be consistent with the permanent 100+ year quality of our complete Building on our Faith project.

The donors of each of these remarkable pieces have so much to be proud of and certainly will feel that not only is each piece stunningly beautiful, but the materials and workmanship are beyond what was imagined. The good news is, there are still opportunities to donate more of these fixtures! Contact Fr. Nick or me for more details.

SAINTLY LIVES

ST. CATHERINE THE GREAT MARTYR OF ALEXANDRIA COMMEMORATED NOVEMBER 25



Saint Catherine, who was from Alexandria, was the daughter of Conostas (or Cestus). She was an exceedingly beautiful maiden, most chaste, and illustrious in wealth, lineage, and learning. By her steadfast understanding, she utterly vanquished the passionate and unbridled soul of Maximinus, the tyrant of Alexandria; and by her eloquence, she stopped the mouths of the so-called philosophers who had gathered to dispute with her. She was crowned with the crown of martyrdom in the year 305. Her Holy Relics were taken by Angels to the holy mountain of Sinai, where they were discovered many years later; the famous monastery of Saint Catherine was originally dedicated to the Holy Transfiguration of the Lord and the Burning Bush, but later was dedicated to Saint Catherine.

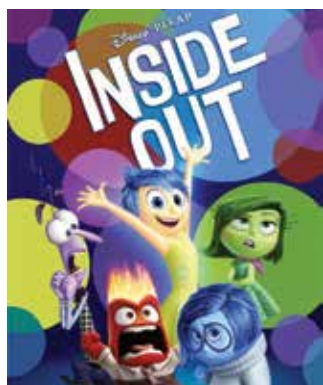

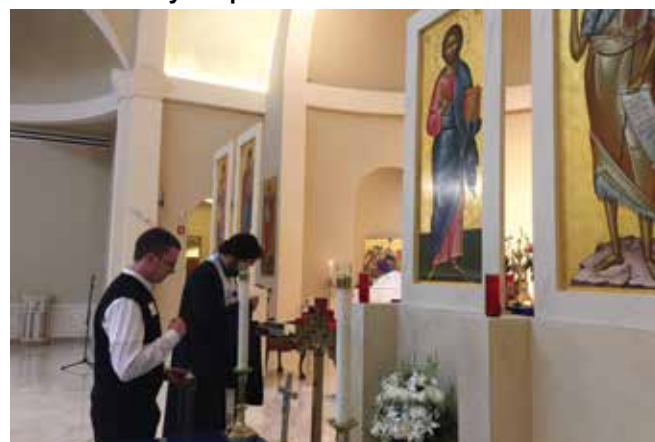
