### FR. NICK'S MESSAGE

#### **Pentecost**

"When the day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place." Acts 2:1

My Dear Parishioners,

Christos Anesti! Christ is Risen!

Together, not long ago, we have celebrated, the "Feasts of Feasts" the Resurrection of Christ from the dead. Jesus' victory over death is the single most important event in human history! Christ has not only come to walk, heal and speak to us about His Father's love for His creation but to literally give His life for it. "I have come to seek and to save the lost" He has told us. Christ's words and actions lead Him to the Cross and also leads us to an empty tomb where all His promises are realized and where eternal life is made manifest.

Things did not end there for although Christ's victory over death and the Kingdom was revealed and proclaimed, still that early Church in Jerusalem remained fragile. The handful of frightened disciples, men and women, still had to overcome adversities beyond their strength. Nevertheless, Christ's words **burned** within them as did the promise that He would not leave them as orphans. The promise of the Holy Spirit, the Counselor and Advocate that came on Pentecost, transformed these men and women of flesh and blood into fiery witnesses that **no power** could contain. On that one day alone, thousands were converted, their eyes opened and hearts and minds grew as they came to experience the full knowledge of truth that is the foundation of our Christian faith. The Church was born and the **Gates of Hell** shall not prevent its existence despite the many assaults through time down to today.

My beloved brothers and sisters, Pentecost reminds us of the birth of the Church as the Spirit- **the Holy Spirit**- moves within it and within us as the Body of Christ. Externally, the many challenges within society and the failings and weaknesses of us all today as fellow Christians are all too obvious. Perhaps these deficiencies are no different than those faced by the frightened and vulnerable few of the infant Church in Jerusalem long ago. Yet we know what power came from them and may also lie dormant within us. Deep down within Christ's Church and yes, within us too, there lies the power of the **Holy Spirit**, waiting to be realized and actualized planted within us at our Baptism. Once that power becomes manifest and is discovered anew, the **unwaning light** we received on Pascha night can illumine and transform our lives and overcome all obstacles. Discover it and unbridle its awesome power!

That is what I wish for our beloved community, for you and your family as we approach the Great Feast of Pentecost!



### **STEWARDSHIP**

Xristos Anesti! Christ is Risen!

As the school year rushes to a close and graduations abound I often reflect on what I had hoped to accomplish and what I did accomplish during the past year. At the top of my list every year is kindness and gratitude. These always seem like such simple goals: being kind and grateful each day. But far too often I find that life's circumstances try to get in the way, try to take away my peace. Someone cuts me off while I'm driving, or cuts in front of a line; someone doesn't return the respect we show them. It's all too easy to want to 'set the record straight.' And while I'm not perfect, I've found over the years with the help of God's wisdom through my family and friends the strength to always come back to my peace. Scripture is the source of all knowledge and all wisdom. If it were possible to capture in words all the Good that is God, scripture is the preeminent source for all that we need in order to weather life's challenges. But we must put scripture into practice. We must put into daily use the staff and rod of God's loving wisdom.

Stewardship needs this same kind of daily practice. Stewardship is defined by our Orthodox Church as threefold. In a real sense it is reflective of the threefold aspect of Divinity. We are asked to give our Time, our Talents, and our Treasure in the Lord's service. When reflecting on my stewardship commitment, too often I find myself having that internal conversation with myself and not the Lord. Too often I tell myself that I've done enough. I've done my part; and yes, we all have our parts to play; but when I stop to consider how that same conversation would go with God, I realize that I cannot be honest and say, "Well, Lord, I've done my part. I've done enough! I know I can't present that conversation to our Lord because when I look openly and honestly at my life, I know that God has never said to me, "John, I've done my part. I've done enough. You're own your own." No, God has never and will never say those words to us. If we take one step to Him, like the loving Father that He is, He will run a thousand steps to meet us. I ask you to consider having a stewardship conversation with Christ. I know many of you have had this conversation. Your generosity is reflective of your ongoing conversation that builds our eternal relationship with the Lord. But if you haven't had this conversation openly and honestly, I'm asking you today, to speak with the Lord and ask Him to come into your heart and guide you to do and become all the He means for you to be. I know and I believe that if we have this heart to heart conversation with Christ, He will change our lives from the ordinary days of existence, toward the extraordinary day of eternal life. ### **Holy and Great Council to Convene in Crete**

An historic gathering for the Orthodox Christian Churches, the first of its kind in 1200 years, is being supported with both digital communications and a multilingual team of experts.

A website, www.orthodoxcouncil.org, provides background information on the Holy and Great Council, which will meet in Crete June 16-27 and gathers representatives from the 14 autocephalous (internally self-governing) Orthodox Churches to discuss issues ranging from the mission of the Orthodox Church in the modern world and its relations with other Christian

churches, to the importance of fasting and the sacrament of marriage. The patriarchs of the 14 Churches, including the ancient churches of Constantinople, Alexandria, Antioch, and Jerusalem, as well as more recent churches of Albania, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Czech Lands and Slovakia, Georgia, Greece, Romania, Russia, Serbia and Poland, will also discuss how the Orthodox Church determine autonomy and matters related to the Orthodox diaspora. The Churches have been preparing for this unprecedented Council for almost a century.
