## FR. NICK'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners:

There is no question that the pace of life has quickened both at work and at home. More and more is being added onto our plate and more is expected from us. Although we are told that in this era of iphones, voicemails, and emails our lives would be easier, we suspect otherwise. We also see this with our children's activities which often exhaust us and our resources, turn us into chauffeurs and activity coordinators. Managing our busy lives, worrying about tomorrow and overseeing the **cares of this life** can be truly challenging. The Lord knows this. He knows our needs and knows the challenges we face in our everyday lives. For this reason, He set a day for rest. The Lord's Day, the Sabbath, the Seventh Day, was set aside to rejuvenate the body and fill the soul. It is a day when we are to **set aside the cares of life**, as the beautiful hymn of the Divine Liturgy reminds us, and to focus on our relationship with God and each other. It is the one day the Lord has set aside to be fully present in Him, and we are invited to be with Him. Sunday worship and the Divine Liturgy are important ingredients toward realizing this goal. However, some feel that "going to church" is a chore and feel more "compelled" to go rather than in the spirit of the psalmist, be able to say, **O Lord, I have loved the beauty of your house and the place where your glory dwells**. We come to His house each Sunday to hear His word, to pray with others who share the faith, to receive and be reminded of His many blessings. If we come fully prepared, we will stand ready before Him asking that He stir our hearts as we commit our whole life to Christ, who now seeks to dwell within us through His Body and His Blood! What then are we missing when all that is said above never settles into our hearts and our minds? What benefit is gained when we arrive, sadly, at the last moment? How have, indeed, the **cares of this life** crowded out that **one needful thing**, the desire to be with God? We expect and ask so much from Him as we offer up our requests and prayers especially in times of trouble and need, yet He does not occupy the place of honor and priority that He truly deserves. **I am the way and the truth and the life**, He tells us. Is He really the **way and the truth and the life** for us? Perhaps this New Ecclesiastical Year, we can reclaim Sunday to be His day—the Lord's Day. **Let us set aside the cares of this life** and begin by coming to Church at the very beginning to experience what God desires of us, to Worship and Glorify Him. Let us not neglect what is most beneficial, most important to our souls, by choosing the fleeting and material over the eternal and spiritual. Only God's Presence can help us do that.

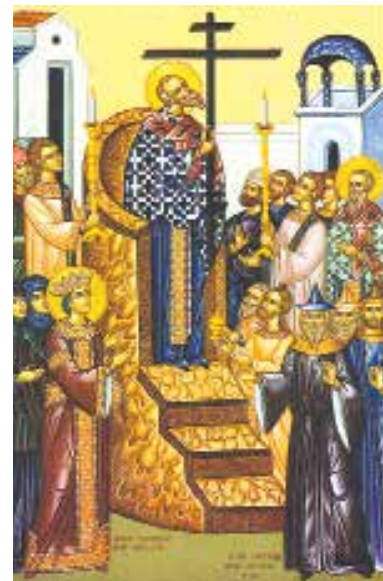
## Monthly Paraklesis Services

## THE ELEVATION OF THE CROSS- SEPT. 14TH

For over 1900 years the cross has been a beloved symbol for the believing Christian. We view the cross in two ways. It is, first of all, a sign of Christ's love for us, for it reveals the extent of his suffering and the stark reality of death for our sakes. St Paul speaks of Jesus humbling himself: "...and (He) became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." This is to say, Christ accepted the most extreme form of suffering and death. Could there be a greater display of love and sacrifice than to live for man and then die for him by Crucifixion?



In the ancient world, crucifixion was the most horrible form of capital punishment; it was used only for the worst criminals. Who can describe the physical pain of hanging on the cross? Who can describe the spiritual pain in those darkest hours? It is no wonder that, upon the cross, He cried out to His Father, "My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?"

The Cross is, secondly, intimately connected to our own lives. Orthodox Christians must never associate the cross only with Christ, for there is a cross for every believer in the Lord. "Who-soever will come after Me," Christ said, "let him take up his cross, and deny himself and follow Me." So, there is a cross for each of us.

Now it is one thing to glorify and praise the cross as a symbol of Christ's great love and devotion, but it is another thing to accept the cross as central to our daily lives. This is precisely what the cross must be for us — a way of life. For us, to come into the world and be baptized is to become a cross-bearer.

All are welcome. Please note, we welcome 4-year old children to participate in the Pre-Kindergarten program.

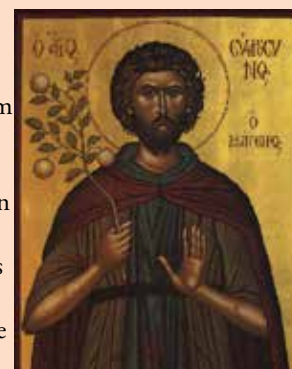

## SAINTLY LIVES

### EUPHROSYNOS THE COOK, COMMEMORATED SEPT. 11

St. Euphrosynos lived as an ordinary monk in the 9th century and was very simple and faithful, humbly serving as the cook of the monastery in which he lived. One night the spiritual father of that monastery dreamt that he was in Paradise where he was surprised to see St. Euphrosynos, who gave him three beautiful apples from a tree there. When he awoke, he saw the three apples lying on his pillow much to his amazement. They were very fragrant. Rushing to St. Euphrosynos, he asked him where he had been last night, and the saint said, “where you were, Father.” Before this, no one had paid attention or given respect to the cook in that monastery, but often the opposite. When the spiritual father told the other monks about the holiness of St. Euphrosynos, which he had just discovered, St. Euphrosynos fled the monastery into the desert for the rest of his life, fearing the praise of men. May this humble servant of God teach us by his example and by his prayers to seek the Heavenly Kingdom first, and live humbly serving our brothers or sisters gladly, until Heavenly fruit grows in us. St. Euphrosynos is the patron saint of chefs and cooks.
