Gratitude

Dear Parishioners,

November is the month we celebrate Thanksgiving. It is that holiday where many of us pause to remember how fortunate we are to have so many blessings and gifts in our life. Although it is a human tendency to want more and to only be aware of what we do not have, Thanksgiving gives us the opportunity to give thanks for what God has given us. The Spirit of Stewardship, of gratitude, and the experience of it is more blessed to give than to receive is closer to our hearts during this season of Thanksgiving and of course Christmas.

Recently, I came across a beautiful story of two brothers that I would like to share with you. It is a metaphor of what life could be if love is our primary aim.

Time before time, when the world was young, two brothers shared a field and a mill, each night dividing evenly the grain they had ground together during the day. One brother lived alone; the other had a wife and a large family. Now the single brother thought to himself one day, "It isn't really fair that we divide the grain evenly. I have only myself to care for, but my brother has children to feed." So each night he secretly took some of his grain to his brother's granary to see that he was never without.

But the married brother said to himself one day, "It isn't really fair that we divide the evenly, because I have children to provide for me in my old age, but my brother has no one. What will he do when he is old?" So every night he secretly took some of

As a result, both of them always found their sup-ply of grain mysteriously replenished each morning. Then one night in the darkness they met each other halfway between their two houses, suddenly realizing what had been happening, and embraced each other in love. The story is that God witnessed their meeting and proclaimed, "This is a holy place-a place of love- and here it is that my temple shall be built." And so it was. The holy place, where God is made known to his people, is the place where human be-ings discover each other and give to each other in love ings discover each other and give to each other in love.

Imagine a "holy place" such as this where giving of ourselves out of love to benefit the other is possible. Perhaps, although not perfect, our St. Demetrios Church can be that place where we strive to live our Christian faith and built on our faith. How can that be achieved? It can be achieved by living the spirit of Thanksgiving and gratitude each day. It also can be renewed each time we come to St. Demetrios and then go out and proclaim the message of love in words and actions wherever we go. Encountering the living Lord in each person we meet on our Christian walk by showing love, compassion, and respect will confirm that God's hand has built His temple both physically in our midst and spiritually in our heart. Thanksgiving then will become more than a holiday in November but a constant presence of God in our life.

Indeed, this will be the cause of continued great joy and Thanksgiving throughout the year!

St. Andrew the Apostle Commemorated November 30



Born in Bethsaida, St. Andrew was a fisherman by trade. He became a dedicated disciple of John the Baptist and then, following his baptism, left him to become the first Apostle of Jesus Christ. He also brought along his brother, Peter. Both are numbered among the Twelve Great Apostles. After Pentecost, St. Andrew was chosen to preach in a host of lands- including Byzantium, Thrace, Peloponnese, Epirus, Georgia and Kiev. He was martyred in the Peloponnese, in the city of Patras, 62 AD

- He is the patron saint of several countries, including Romania and Scotland.
- His feast day is also the name day of our Boston Metropolis.
- Patriarch Bartholomew is considered the spiritual successor of St. Andrew.

St. CATHERINE THE GREAT MARTYR OF ALEXANDRIA **COMMEMORATED NOVEMBER 25**



Saint Catherine, who was from Alexandria, was the daughter of Constas (or Cestus). She was an exceedingly beautiful maiden, most chaste, and illustrious in wealth, lineage, and learning. By her steadfast understanding, she utterly vanquished the passionate and unbridled soul of Maximinus, the tyrant of Alexandria; and by her eloquence, she stopped the mouths of the so-called

philosophers who had gathered to dispute with her. She was crowned with the crown of martyrdom in the year 305. Her Holy Relics were taken by Angels to the holy mountain of Sinai, where they were discovered many years later; the famous monastery of Saint Catherine was originally dedicated to the Holy Transfiguration of the Lord and the Burning Bush, but later was dedicated to Saint Catherine.

In the early days of our Church, St. Paul provided guidance about stewardship. In his Second Letter to the Corinthians (9:6-11), he told us to remember that,

God is the source of all we have, both for ourselves and for all our good works,

• each person ". . . must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver", and

• our generosity will both enrich our lives, and produce thanksgiving to God.

To better explain this message, St. Paul told his contemporaries what they already knew: a farmer who plants only a few seeds will have a small harvest, whereas a farmer who plants lots of seeds will have a big harvest. In Paul's message, we Christians are the farmers, our contributions of time, talent, and treasure are the seeds, and the enrichment of our souls and thanksgiving to God are our harvest.

Thank you to all our fellow "farmers" for your continued supply of "seeds" to support all we do at St. Demetrios.
