DOCKETING STATEMENT FOR THE APPELLANT

Statement of Jurisdiction

This is an appeal from the United States District Court for the Western District of Wisconsin (No. 3:11-cv-00099-bbc) (Judge Barbara B. Crabb).¹

On February 9, 2011, the United States filed in the District Court a complaint seeking relief related to an injunction issued by the Wisconsin State Circuit Court for Dane County on November 8, 2010,

that purported to prevent the United States from collecting (or possibly even assessing) any potential federal tax liability owed by Ambac Assurance Corporation and other members of its consolidated group. (Doc. 1; Doc. 23 (amended complaint).) The District Court had jurisdiction over the United States' complaint pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 7402(a) (jurisdiction to issue orders, writs, etc., to enforce the internal revenue laws) and 28 U.S.C. § 1331 (federal questions), § 1340 (internal revenue), and § 1345 (United States as plaintiff). In an order issued on February 18, 2011, however, the District Court stated that it would dismiss this case for lack of subject matter jurisdiction. (Doc. 42.) According to the court, the McCarran-Ferguson Act (15 U.S.C. §§ 1011-1015) allowed the Wisconsin insurance statutes to reversepreempt the federal jurisdictional statutes. (Id. at 4-8.) We will discuss our disagreements with the District Court's analysis in our opening brief.

On February 18, 2011, the District Court entered a final judgment dismissing this case for lack of subject matter jurisdiction. (Doc. 43.)

On February 22, 2011, the United States timely filed a notice of appeal within 60 days after the entry of the District Court's judgment. (Doc.

44.) 28 U.S.C. § 2107(b). This Court has jurisdiction over this appeal pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1291.

Statement of Prior or Related Appeals

This appeal is related to the currently pending appeal *Theodore*Nickel v. United States (7th Cir. – No. 11-1158), also arising out of

litigation in the United States District Court for the Western District of

Wisconsin (No. 3:10-cv-00778-bbc). The United States intends to file a

motion to consolidate the two appeals.
