














FOCUS AREAS

SWEDISH FILM IS HERE

Exhilarating Swedish Film storms DIFF this year with a focus on this diverse and impressive filmmaking nation. Lukas Moodysson's films (*Lilya 4-Ever, Together, A Hole In My Heart*) have regularly appeared at DIFF, and his latest film, *Mammoth* is a beautifully made, layered and tense study of the impacts of globalisation on our lives, hearts and minds. The film stars Gael Garcia Bernal and Michelle Williams.

Jesper Ganslandt's *The Ape* is a devastating and meticulous account of a man's descent into a personal hell after he wakes up on the bathroom floor one morning, bloodied and disoriented.

Tarik Saleh's exquisite animated film *Metropia*, featuring the voices of Vincent Gallo and Juliette Lewis, takes a look at a near-future Europe in which mind-control is being exerted in a most unusual way.

Sebbe marks the arrival of a striking new talent, Babak Najafi. This superb debut takes us into the life of a young misfit and his negligent mother. Beautifully filmed, with superb performances, this is a compassionate portrait of difference.

Rounding up the Swedish focus is Niels Arden Oplev's *The Girl With A Dragon Tattoo*, based on the best-selling book by Stieg Larsson. A finely crafted thriller encompassing history, politics and sex, the film is every bit as compelling as the book.

SWEDISH FILM IS BERGMAN

The director most synonymous with Swedish cinema is, of course, the great master Ingmar Bergman (1918-2007), one of cinema's greatest talents. His influential body of work confronts the human situation, in all its bleakness and despair, its comedy and hope. Bergman directed over sixty films and documentaries for cinema release and for television, most of which he wrote himself, and also directed over one hundred and seventy plays. His films were nearly always set in the Swedish landscape and his recurring themes were death, illness, betrayal and insanity, although a strangely dispassionate joy is maintained in even his darkest works. Providing an extremely rare opportunity to see these masterpieces on the big screen, Swedish Film Is Bergman comprises Smiles Of A Summer's Night (1955), Wild Strawberries (1957), Winter Light (1963), Cries And Whispers (1973) and Fanny And Alexander (1982).

AFRICA IN MOTION

DIFF 2010 presents no less than nine world premieres of South African feature films and will open with the world premiere of State Of Violence, directed by Khalo Matabane. State Of Violence is the story of a man whose wife is murdered in what seems like a random act of violence. He embarks on a search for the killer, only to discover that the killing is linked to the darkness in his past.

DIFF also presents the African Premiere of Life, Above All, directed by Oliver Schmitz (Mapantsula, Hijack Stories). Life, Above All is a moving film about a bright and hardworking young girl who fights the fear and prejudice that is poisoning her community.

Jahmil XT Qubekas' A Small Town Called Descent, starring Vusi Kunene and Hlubi Mboya, will also have its World Premiere at DIFF. Stylish and original, with elements of a Western, the film is a police procedural set around a xenophobic murder in a small town.

Jann Turner's much-anticipated follow-up to the box office hit White Wedding will also make its debut at the festival, Rapulana Seiphemo and Kenneth Nkosi star in Paradise Stop, a thrilling, and funny, ride through crime, corruption and religion.

Other world premieres of South African feature films are the hilarious Attack Of The Indian Werewolf by Masood Boomgard, Jyoti Mistry's striking experimental film The Bull On The Roof (Le Boeuf Sur Le Toit), and Regardt van den Bergh's charming The Incredible Adventures Of Hanna Hoekom (Die Ongelooflike Avonture van Hanna Hoekom).

Also making their debut are the gangland action film *Jozi Kings* by Jonathan Boynton-Lee and Jamie Ramsay, the inspirational *Machansa* by Muntu Zwane which stars Siyabonga Shibe, and the quirky romantic comedy *Visa/Vie* by Elan Gamaker.

From elsewhere on the continent, DIFF proudly showcases A Screaming Man by Mahamet-Saleh Haroun who recently won the Jury Prize at Cannes for his extraordinary film about the damaged relationship between a father and son, set against the backdrop of civil strife.

From Uganda comes Talent Campus Durban alumnus Caroline Kamya's *Imani*, an energetic, multi-narrative film.

Tunisian Raja Amari's *Buried Secrets* is a feminist coming-of-age thriller bathed in the disturbing magic of a dark fairy tale, while Kenyan Hawa Essuman's *Soul Boy* is an endearing and inspirational film for both adults and children.

Commissioned by the International Film Festival Rotterdam for their Forget Africa programme, *Memories of a Burning Tree* is the work of Singaporean director Sherman Ong who made the film in Tanzania and shot it in Swahili. The result is a riveting ensemble piece that is a truly global piece of cinema.

AFRICAN REALITIES

DIFFs' documentary programme sharpens our insight into a spectrum of African Realities. South Africa's turbulent history becomes a lot clearer through Connie Field's articulate exposition of how the sports boycott became a turning point for political change in Have You Heard from Johannesburg: Fairplay, while The Cradock Four covers the abduction and killing of activists during the seventies and early eighties. Built around Strini Moodley's last known filmed interview, Savo Tufegdzic's Sons of the Sand is a riveting testament to the co-founder of the Black Consciousness Movement. Filled with rare archival footage, RFK in the Land of Apartheid – A Ripple of Hope tells of Robert Kennedy's historic visit to South Africa during the oppressive 1960s.

Rehad Desai dramatically addresses inner city conflicts and concerns in *The Battle for Johannesburg*, while *When the Mountain Meets its Shadow* tells the stories of the fight for survival in the informal settlements and townships around Cape Town. The Foster brothers' *My Hunter's Heart* follows an epic journey by younger members of the Khomani San as they try to recapture some of the knowledge and skills of their ancestors.

Other offerings include miracles of the mind in Renée Scheltema's Something Unknown Is Doing We Don't Know What; Steve Kwena Mokwena's aesthetic meditation on postcolonial

Africa in *Driving With Fanon*; Mzimasi Gova's reflection on golf development in black townships in *The Fairway*; Josh Sternlicht's *Fool In A Bubble*, a candid exploration into the journey and conflicts of cult Durban musician/poet, Syd Kitchen; Carlos Franciso's *American Foulbrood*, which looks at the crippling effects and possible impacts of a deadly disease on African honey bees; *Letters From Teddy*, Terry Westby-Nunn's deeply poignant story set against the backdrop of British colonial society in Aden in the 1950s; and Sara Bletcher's *Surfing Soweto*, an amazing, and dangerous, coming of age story that follows a group of Soweto teenagers who surf moving trains.

Mugabe and the White African is an extraordinary tale of defiance, hope and perseverance in the face of injustice and brutality, as a white farmer challenges Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe in an international court. Koundi and the National Thursday is an inside look at life in a village community in the forests of Cameroon. Coming out of the Nkuta introduces us to brave Cameroonians who struggle for a sense of value and legitimacy for gay people within their communities; Kinshasa Symphony focuses on the formation of an orchestra against the colourful backdrop of Kinshasa; while the superb Congo in Four Acts is a quartet of short documentaries that lay bare the reality of everyday life in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Additionally, the short documentary packages offer a variety of revealing insights into Ugandan and Nigerian society, and of course South Africa.

CINEMA MONDIAL TOUR: HUBERT BALS FUND AND JAN VRIJMAN FUND FILMS IN AFRICA

The Hubert Bals Fund (HBF) and Jan Vrijman Fund (JVF), which provide support to filmmakers in developing countries, have set up a joint film programme that will tour film festivals in Africa until March 2011. Cinema Mondial Tour consists of a total of 12 fiction films and documentaries, all made with support from the Hubert Bals Fund and the Jan Vrijman Fund, respectively. As part of the International Film Festival Rotterdam (IFFR), the HBF focuses specifically on the realisation of fiction films. The JVF, which is part of the International Documentary Film Festival Amsterdam (IDFA), is geared to offering support to creative documentaries

All participating festivals make their own selection from the films chosen by the HBF and JVF. DIFF presents *Soul Boy* by Hawa Essuman (Kenya, 2010) and *Congo in Four Acts* by Dieudo Hamadi, Divita Wa Lusala and Kiripi Katembo Siku (Democratic Republic of Congo, South Africa, 2010)

The Cinema Mondial Tour will run until mid-2011 and will visit film festivals in several African countries, including Kenya, Ethiopia, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda and Benin.

WORLD CINEMA FUND SPOTLIGHT

The World Cinema Fund (WCF) was founded in 2004 as an initiative of the German Federal Cultural Foundation (Kulturstiftung des Bundes) and the Berlin International Film Festival. The Goethe Insitut subsequently came on board as a partner. The aim of the WCF is to support filmmakers from transition countries. Until 2007, the geographical focus has been on Latin America, Africa, the Middle East and Central Asia. In 2007, the WCF announced an expansion of the focus regions: since then film projects from South East Asia and the Caucasus are also eligible for support from the WCF. The WCF, within a short time, has established itself as one of the leading institutions in the field of international funding of artistically ambitious films. WCF-supported films appearing at DIFF 2010 are *The Milk Of Sorrow (La Teta Asustada)* by Claudia Llosa (Spain/Peru 2009) and *Giant (Gigante)* by Adrien Binez, Uruguay/Argentina/Germany/Spain 2009.

THEMES

ECO-LENS AT DIFF 2010

Filmmakers are key agents in keeping a watchful eye on not just on social and political issues but on environmental abuse that often slips unobtrusively into our daily lives. A number of films at this year's DIFF conscientise us about the need for integrated approaches to development, and the threats to human ecology and environmental balance.

With genetic modification shifting global food production increasingly further from nature, *Scientists Under Attack* is an important expose on the influence of big corporates in the active suppression of information and how scientists must put their careers on the line just to bring you the truth about what you consume.

Carlos Franciso's *American Foulbrood* looks at the crippling effects of a deadly disease on African honey bees and its possible impact on food production in South Africa.

When the water that comes out of your taps turns to fire you know something is wrong. The highly entertaining Sundance Jury Prize Winner Gasland explores the shocking consequences of massive natural gas drilling across the USA. Koundi and the National Thursday is an intimate look at life inside a small village in the forests of Cameroon and how this communal society is negotiating the demands of globalization and the search for uniquely African solutions. Questions about urban development are raised in The Battle for Johannesburg and When The Mountain Meets Its Shadow. The feature film Altiplano is set against mercury poisoning of a community from a local factory.

Two films very much emphasise positive developments for our consideration. In multi-award winning *Waste Land* we witness the creative production that results when art and poverty collide at the world's largest garbage dump in Brazil. The collaboration with

catadores, who make a living picking recyclable materials, deals not only with important environmental and social issues, but restores dignity to a group of people tossed aside by society, like the garbage with which they work. The 4th Revolution: Energy Autonomy systematically and engagingly outlines the tantalising possibility of switching to 100% renewable energy sources in the next 30 years.

Such films provide a proactive approach to the challenges and indicate that another way is possible.

WAVESCAPES SURF FILM FESTIVAL

The Wavescapes Surf Film Festival presents a five-day feast of award-winning surf films. Included are the mind-bending aerial attack of the Modern Collective and the ultimate trip of the surf gypsy in Cancer to Capricorn. Wavescapes brings you the vivid, digital world of the ridiculously rich waves of the North Shore in Fibreglass and Megapixels, but present a dark, drug-scarred underbelly documented in Sea of Darkness. Feature documentary Lives of the Artists follows Irish surfers, a French snowboarder and a British punk band on a quest for their artistic holy grail. The visceral poetry of The Present is a counterpoint to the rugged 10-year migration to Dungeons in Quest for Fear, while the soul-filled forays into women's surfing in Dear & Yonder flows with the Zen-like escape for Rob Machado in The Drifter.





DIFF in 2010: Deepening Partnerships

DIFF's Seminar and Workshop programmes have grown considerably over the years and contribute significantly to skills transfer and industry development, especially in KwaZulu-Natal. Addressing topical industry challenges, providing information and inspiration for aspirant filmmakers and professionals, the range of programmes on offer caters for all levels. Partnerships are key to film development in South Africa, Africa and the global film environment, and such partnerships are an integral element in DIFF's range of workshops, screenings and special events. Partnership and support by the National Film and Video Foundation (NFVF) across the past decade remains a core foundation for DIFF, while cooperation with a broad spectrum of partners enables DIFF to continue to deliver opportunities to filmmaking constituencies. In order to widen access to these programmes, most workshops are open and free, to professionals and public alike.

The Talents, who were selected through a rigorous application process, will also have the opportunity to attend screenings and events at the 31st Durban International Film Festival. The 3rd Talent Campus Durban, themed Focusing on Africa: Unleashing Talent in 2010, will centre activities on the development and strengthening of partnerships between African filmmakers. Talent Campus Durban is held in cooperation with the Berlinale Talent Campus, the eighth edition of which formed part of the 60th Berlin International Film Festival in February this year.

Talent Campus is a global partnership and, apart from the main event in Berlin, Talent Campus partnerships take place at selected festivals in Buenos Aires, Guadalajara and Sarajevo. It is a considerable privilege and sign of success of our first two editions that DIFF has again been invited to host a Talent Campus. Another positive sign is that Durban Talent Campus alumni films appear in all sections of the festival, including the feature film category.

This year's focus on strengthening partnerships is especially important as the Durban FilmMart (see page 29), which specifically targets African projects, launches at the festival and runs parallel to Talent Campus. Talent Campus Durban, with over 40 participants representing nearly 20 African countries, is set to gain even more momentum.

3rd Talent Campus Durban is a partnership project between the Durban International Film Festival in cooperation with the Berlinale Talent Campus, Berlin International Film Festival, and is supported by the German Embassy in South Africa, the Goethe-Institut, the Department of Economic Development and Tourism, KwaZulu-Natal, the Commonwealth Foundation and Art Moves Africa.



The inaugural Durban FilmMart (23 to 26 July 2010) is a joint programme of the Durban International Film Festival and the Durban Film Office, supported by the City of Durban.

A fine example of the globalised story made popular by Alejandro Iñárritu's *Babel, Altiplano* is structured around the stories of two women from very different realities. Grace is a disillusioned war photographer whose doctor husband has gone off to work with the indigenous Andean people in Peru, while Saturnina is a young Peruvian woman who has just become engaged. When mercury from a local factory poisons the community, the resulting events affect both of them in profound ways. *Alitiplano* lyrically connects the dots across time and continents.

After making their way through US customs, the two of them join Muna's sister in Illinois. But Muna, who managed to lose all her savings on the way over, desperately needs a job and despite her two degrees and long experience in the banking sector, is forced to settle for a job at a fast food joint. This charmingly made film is a moving account of immigrant life in America.

This daringly minimalist feature from director Jesper Ganslandt is a sparse, carefully considered account of a middle-aged driving instructor named Krister who wakes up on the bathroom floor one morning, bloodied and disoriented. The camera follows him as he goes about his day as if nothing has happened, and gradually a dark truth emerges. Within this claustrophobic narrative, Ganslandt skilfully approximates the texture of an ever-worsening nightmare, using first-person perspective and handheld camera work to increase the sense of proximity to an incomprehensible protagonist. This descent into one man's personal hell is an innovative and emotionally convincing masterpiece.

Looking to escape the burden of his alcoholic mother, 23-year-old Tuck Chai strikes a relationship with a 15-year-old schoolgirl. When their relationship is discovered by the girl's mother, the well-off parents threaten to sue but instead reach a monetary settlement in exchange for their silence. In this tenderly rendered narrative based on real-life events, director Ho Yuhang (Rain Dogs) goes beyond the sensationalist surface to explore universal issues of class, identity and sexuality.

East Coast Radio jock and comedian, Neville Pillay, plays a timid, hardworking clerk in an electronics store who transforms into a werewolf after accidentally eating the mystical jadoo bean. The brutalised corpses mount up, the cops are stumped and it is left to an intrepid journalist to try to cure the hapless werewolf. Hilarious and with a uniquely Durban flavour, *Indian Werewolf* is bound to become a cult classic. Filmmakers in attendance

Au Revoir Taipei comes from first-time writer-director Arvin Chen whose beautifully rendered film is a tribute not only to urban life in Taipei but to the bright lights of every big city. Set during a young man's final night in his hometown, the film follows an ensemble of characters in a shimmering multiple narrative located in a small, cosy neighbourhood. Well-crafted, overflowing with joy and romance, filled with surreal moments and superb performances, Au Revoir Taipei marks Chen as a major talent.

Bathed in personal and national mythology, Baaria is an ambitious full-blown epic in the tradition of old-school Italian cinema. A lyrical comment on the nature of family and the impact of modernity on traditional life, this heartfelt tribute to the power of personal history opened the last Venice Film Festival.

Magistrate Mikael's growing suspicions and concerns quickly descend into obsession and delusion as he becomes increasingly unrelenting in his quest to end the supposed love affair between his children. With performances of great depth from the three members of the *Bad Family* and hyper-real cinematography, this is a compelling, disturbing and very funny account of family history and psychological collapse.

BLESSED

From the director of the acclaimed *Head On*, this emotionally raw multiple-narrative chronicles 24 hours in the life of a group of Australian working-class teenagers in distress. *Blessed* consists of two distinct sections recounting the same sequence of events, first from the children's perspective, and then from the mothers'. The film tenderly and honestly explores the difficulties involved in growing up and the primal relationships we have with our mothers. Beautifully filmed, with an ensemble of superb performances at its centre, *Blessed's* portrait of family relationships will stay with you long after you have left the theatre.

As their sexual relationship turns into love, Jimmy is forced to reconsider his ideological approach and is urged by Lars to leave the gang for his own safety. While the film's subject matter is sensationalist, its content is not, and the unlikely relationship between the two men is played out with sensitivity and honesty. Brotherhood won the top prize at the 2009 Rome Film Festival.

THE BULL ON THE ROOF (LE BOEUF SUR LE TOIT)

d. Jyoti Mistry, South Africa 2010 PF

Le Boeuf Sur Le Toit is an experimental feature that deals with disparate narratives in Johannesburg, Helsinki, Vienna, and New York. The result is a kaleidoscopic snapshot of urban spaces – walking through cities, taking ferries, riding trains, having an escapist picnic – which manipulates the viewers' sense of place. The geographic disorientation is further heightened by voice-overs in multiple languages, but everything is held seamlessly together by the familiarity of day-to-day life. When a young couple moves into the main part of the mansion, Aicha becomes hopelessly fascinated with their world of parties, high heels and lipstick. But her sheltered mother and sister will do everything in their power to keep her from that world. A feminist coming-of-age thriller bathed in the disturbing magic of a dark fairy tale.

At the apartment, which they fondly refer to as "The Ranch", they talk, drink, smoke and dance their way through life. This is an accurate and affectionate portrait of the last days of youth, gorgeously rendered by Letourneur who grants her characters their foibles and weaknesses without allowing them to enter the realm of spectacle or dramatic catharsis.

But the fictions of Karina's making are echoed in the parallel realities of the middle class couple and Karina's family who are vacationing on the beach. An impressive first film, this is as beautiful and unsettling as any beach at night.

Thirty years ago, the renowned conductor of the Bolshoi orchestra was fired for hiring Jewish musicians. Now a mere cleaning man at the Bolshoi, he intercepts an official invitation from the prestigious Théâtre du Châtelet that is meant for the orchestra. He decides to gather together his former musicians, now aging alcoholics, and to perform in Paris in place of the current Bolshoi, completing the Tchaikovsky concerto that was interrupted three decades earlier. Beautifully constructed, *The Concert* is a wickedly absurd satire and a poignant commentary on life under Soviet rule.

In this carefully observed dramatic comedy, the incomparable Isabelle Huppert (who also appears in *White Material*) abandons her usual ice-queen persona for a free-wheeling comic role. Set in Belgium, the film tells of Babou, a bohemian mother who is determined to win back the love of her long-suffering daughter Esmeralda (whose fondness for the eponymous Astrid Gilberto song provides the film's title). Having never held down a steady job, she enters the dubious world of real estate agents, trying to sell timeshare apartments in the coastal resort town of Ostend. Visually lovely, and superbly directed. *Copacabana* is a gorgeous breeze of a film.

Kept separated from the world, with no access to media or cellphones or any information, they are brought up in a bubble created by their parents. But the fragile nature of their reality, constructed from the truths, semi-truths and lies fed to them by their parents, is revealed when an outsider, brought in to service the son's sexual needs, enters the house. Brilliantly directed and superbly written, *Dogtooth* is chilling and darkly funny. Filmmaker in attendance

Omaj and Waj attend a terrorist training camp in Pakistan while Barry and Faisal take a different approach and attempt to train crows as bombers. The film culminates in the four ideologically confused men trying to blow themselves up at the London Marathon. With great acting and superb writing, the film pulls off the difficult balancing act of constructing a comedy about terrorism without undermining the serious nature of its subject matter.

The film takes place mostly within the giant supermarket and the surveillance room and the result is both a visual poem to the austerity of 21st century commerce and a comment on their dehumanising nature. By jettisoning the romantic conventions of cinema, Uruguayan director Adrien Binez gives us a strangely serene film that is more genuinely moving than all of Hollywood's swirling overtures.

Heiran is a moving account of one man's struggle which echoes the narratives of both the three million Afghani illegal workers in Iran and similar situations all over the globe. Above all, this is a beautiful and memorable love story.

I KILLED MY MOTHER (J'AI TUE MA MERE)

Hubert, in turn, is constantly rude to her and takes her to task for what he views as her multiple failures. This is a film about love, sex and identity that will appeal to anyone who's ever had difficulty traversing the rocky road of adolescence.

Moloch Tropical is a dark and scathing political comedy from Raoul Peck who gave us the astounding Lumumba and Sometimes in April (DIFF Best Film Winner in 2005). His latest film is an account of the last 24 hours of the reign of a fictitious Haitian president whose monstrous ways have catalysed a revolution. Increasingly deranged and with his support base crumbling, the president still sees himself as some kind of all-powerful emperor. Set in contemporary Haiti during the bicentennial of its independence, Peck's portrait of power in decline captures the essence of dictatorship everywhere and through all time. They relish their new social standing, but they soon discover that being gangsters comes at a price. Other gangs have their hearts set on the thriving locale of Monga and soon the boys' world is thrown upside down. Vividly filmed in supersaturated colour, with great performances, this is a thoroughly engaging variation on the gangster genre.

When the girl is found dead in an abandoned building, Do-joon is convicted of her murder. But his mother refuses to allow that to be the end of things, and takes it upon herself to prove her son's innocence.

Mundane History explores the three-way relationship between a young man who is paralysed from the waist down, the male nurse who attends to him, and the young man's father. Newly disabled. This intimate and life affirming film takes a multitude of issues in its conversational stride. Idiosyncratically edited and paced. Mundane History earned first-time director Anocha Suwichakornpong a Tiger award at Rotterdam earlier this year.

By disturbing the hierarchy. they change the rules of the game – or do they? The Manga comic in the film is based on Machiavelli's seminal 16th century work The Prince, and was created especially for the movie.

Both another disturbing account of human behaviour from Haneke and a depiction of the emergence of fascism, national socialism and ultimately Nazism, this is possibly the director's finest work thus far.

With dazzling cinematography and superb performances, Resnais connects the destinies of several ennui-laden adults into an intriguing web of emotions and personal digressions. Although *Wild Grass* is more light-hearted than the director's early films, Resnais's talents are as formidable as ever.

If Ree fails to find him, her family will be evicted and homeless. Using the Ozark Mountains as a backdrop, director Debra Granik provides a portrait of a woman who is forced, through her own unconditional love, to sacrifice her future on the altar of family.

In this remake of the Coen brothers' brilliant *Blood Simple* from Chinese master Zhang Yimou (*Hero, House Of Flying Daggers*), the original film's dark, deadpan humour becomes a Chinese thriller-farce and the Texan bar is replaced by a solitary noodle joint in the Chinese desert run by Wang and his wife. For the past few months, the wife has been canoodling with the cook and when the local sheriff tells Wang of the infidelity, he hires him to assassinate the lovers. This global collision of some of contemporary cinema's most revered talents is a high energy delight.

INGMAR BERGMAN

RETROSPECTIVE

SWEDISH FILM IS BERGMAN

INGMAR BERGMAN (1918-2007) was a Swedish director, writer and producer for film, stage and television and one of cinema's greatest talents. His influential body of work confronts the human situation, in all its bleakness and despair, its comedy and hope. Described by Woody Allen as "probably the greatest film artist, all things considered, since the invention of the motion picture camera", Bergman is universally recognised as one of the most accomplished dramatic artists of all time. He directed over sixty films and documentaries for cinema release and for television, most of which he wrote himself, and also directed over one hundred and seventy plays. His company



of actors included Liv Ullmann, Bibi Andersson, Erland Josephson and Max von Sydow. His films were nearly always set in the Swedish landscape and his recurring themes were death, illness, betrayal and insanity, although a strangely dispassionate joy is maintained in even his darkest works. His passing in 2007 leaves us with one of the greatest artistic legacies of the twentieth century. The Ingmar Bergman Retrospective is presented at DIFF through the support of the Swedish Film Institute.

CRIES AND WHISPERS (VISKNINGAR OCH ROP)

d. Ingmar Bergman, Sweden 1973

Cries and Whispers depicts the final day of Agnes, who lies in bed with cancer. Those dearest to her – her sisters, Maria and Karin, and her friend Anna – watch over her. In this highly formalised film, Bergman restricts his palette to the colors of blood and his close-ups to images of the soul. The four women desire the strength to face life, to overcome fear and to remove the curtain from behind which they look and admire, but they do not go forth to touch. They are the same person in different stages of realising that to love is to empty oneself of desire, and that life's meaning is to be saved – by giving one's body and soul.

In this most graceful of his films, a tumultuous year in the life of the Ekdahl family is viewed through the eyes of ten-year-old Alexander, whose imagination fuels the magical goings-on leading up to the death of his father. When his mother' remarries to a stern clergyman, all joy is banished from Alexander and his sister Fanny's life, and they – and the movie – are thrust into a kind of gothic horror.

All of the characters in this complicated arrangement gather for a weekend at the country estate of the actress's elderly mother, who works a kind of magic on the ménage of infinite possibilities. This parody of absurdist masculinity was brilliantly reworked by Woody Allen in A Midsummer Niaht's Sex Comedy.
