

News From the Fair Hill Thoroughbred Horse Show

August 9, 2016 (Fair Hill, PA) – The prize list for the Fifth Anniversary Fair Hill Thoroughbred Horse Show (FHTHS) prize list is now available at www.fairhillthoroughbredshow.org. The show will take place September 17 & 18th, 2016 at the Fair Hill show grounds, Elkton, MD.

“Like most riders my age, I grew up riding Thoroughbreds. As a horseman, trainer and rider, I still enjoy this breed. Finding careers after racing for these horses is important to me, as is educating people in training, management, and general care so they can do a better job with their Thoroughbred. FHTS gives me an excellent opportunity to do this, with a knowledgeable group of horseman who care about this like I do,” says FHTS Board Member, Sue Sisco.

Winning Opportunities Go Beyond Prize Money

“We are very excited to be the first horse show to offer a free clinic to competitors and thrilled that Joe Fargis has agreed to conduct the clinic. It will take place December 10-11 at Hilltop Farm in Cecil County, MD,” said Board Member Carol Atterbury. Winners of the clinic will have to have participated in the show and a drawing will determine clinic participants.

The show’s prize money is impressive as well, encouraging riders to participate. The Show is also in its third year of offering the TERF Good Ambassador Scholarships to select competitors, sponsored by the Thoroughbred Education and Research Foundation. The program is designed to support riders who have demonstrated - while at the show

– an ability to retrain their Thoroughbred. Riders are nominated by the judge and show manager, and then asked to submit a brief essay describing how they would use the \$500 scholarship to further their riding careers. At present, four scholarships are awarded each year.

Fair Hill TB Horse Show Announces Judge

Beth Spatz, a fourth-generation horsewoman, will judge this year's show. Beth trained with Hall of Fame inductee Peggy Winans, Raymond Burr as well as George Morris, Robert Hoskins, Rodney Bross and Martha Sifton. Since the late 60s, Beth has been a rider and trainer with many important wins.
