From Pastor Stuart Holland:

Part of our work of faith is discernment. This is the 'waiting and listening for God's nudge in our life' part that we need to do well and yet generally do quite poorly. Part of our poor practice is simply because we do not well... practice it too often. Part of the reason that we do not practice is of course, because we do not always notice the opportunities we have to practice. So while the call committee is working to discern our future direction as a congregation, I'd like to share some of the things I've learned in the work of discernment and transition.

The first thing I learned is that God only rarely, in fact, only extremely rarely, gives an unequivocal sign. The Old Testament and even the New are filled with signs and wonders, blatant, obvious Signs From God. My life? not so much. In fact, I've had only one really obvious Divine Encounter where I had a Word From God. Most of the time God is subtle.

When God is not subtle, hooray! For the rest of the time God tends to work by taking our gifts and history and then shaping this into our future. To have any hope of making good future decisions then, we have to know who we are and what we can do. Thus the first work of discernment is knowing who we are and what we can do. What is our history that brought us to this point, what are our gifts. (And yes, everyone has gifts, even if it is "just" the "ministry of helps" [1 Cor 12.28] or a "talent for loving" [1 John] all of them are gifts).

So church, what are your gifts?

Once we know our gifts, our inclinations can lead us. What excites you? What brings you hope? What could God be inviting you to do in and through this? (That last is the discernment question). Where could God be in all this messy world of hope and strength and unsurety?

To find that last out, we read scripture, listening for a voice that might suggest our direction. We pray in community and alone, seeking in reflection, some hint of a way to go. And, after training our ear, after much practice and work, we begin to see the edges of where we can go.

That is discernment that is the work our call committee is involved with at the moment. Pray for them.

And pray for yourselves as well, that we may all work to see the direction God is calling us into.
