From the Pastor:

Pastors make house calls. I know it's a bit odd and even obvious to say but it's really true. I have an excellent communion kit my father gave me on graduation from seminary and I like to give it an airing from time to time. My colleagues have them too, sometimes steeped in memory, sometimes purely functional. But we all have them and we often use them.

I mention this as part of a gentle reminder that visitation, while not something all pastors do well, is something we tend to do on an ongoing basis so You Have Been Warned. If the phone rings and it's someone claiming to be your pastor looking to arrange a visit, it might really be true.

OK, enough silliness. The truth is that yes, visitation and house blessing and even communion are part of what pastors tend to do. So do be aware that I will be calling for visits as will the next pastor.

And that brings me to the part of the call process where you should have an update. We have the paperwork in and are waiting for names. This is good news because we can start looking at prospective pastors and seeing how pastor and people fit together. These are good things and part of a positive step toward a new beginning here at Faith. It also means that the call committee is going to get a lot quieter, as am I.

We've done a good bit of public work trying to get a sense of who we are and where we can go but once we enter the phase I think of as "active dating" we really can't share as much as we might have before. When we talk about possibilities, when we address candidates, there's going to be a lot of pressure on the committee, on the candidate, and on the people in the pews.

Please trust the committee and pray for them. Pray also for the candidates and for our Yenta Susan that she can makes us a perfect match. Pray also for each other because there's going to be a lot of pressure of the "why isn't anything happening" variety. That said, we really can't share how the dates are going, what our conversations are like, how well we like them, what we think about how they like us. You get the idea.

In my twelve years of ministry, I've been the candidate turned down more often than the one picked and I will tell you that it is a hard emotion to take. It's also tough to make a misstep in front of a committee and have to live with the likelihood that that error was the fatal screw up. To know that I did this in front of a committee is hard, to have the whole parish know? To have the parish not only know but, in their eagerness to research me before hand, to have come and visited the parish I was serving (who might not know that I'm considering another call)? Oy, the ways that can blow up are just too dreadful to count.

I say this mostly to point out that the confidentiality of the committee is not just because Synod makes us be Big Meanies, it actually helps everyone get through an emotionally fraught time prayerfully and well.

In all seriousness, please pray for everyone involved in this process. Pray for each other too.


