- Guinea pigs were crucial for the development of diphtheria and tuberculosis vaccines
- 2. Guinea-pigs are used to test the vaccine against anthrax
- 3. Guinea-pig tissue were instrumental in the discovery and development of beta-blockers to treat high blood pressure
- 4. Guinea-pig intestines have been used to study the 'gut-brain' which contains as many nerve cells as the spinal cord
- 5. Extreme allergic reaction and asthma studies use guinea pigs
- 6. Vitamin C was discovered though research on guinea pigs
- 7. Guinea pigs are ideal animal model to study auditory systems
- 8. A guinea pig has a similar immune system to humans and is therefore important in the study of infectious disease
- 9. Giant three metre guinea pigs used to roam the earth
- 10. Eating faecal matter is healthy for guinea pigs


