New Plans for Philly Free Speech Zone

This November, the American Humanist Association began a secular holiday advertisement campaign. Signs on buses around Washington D.C. proclaimed "Why believe in a god? Just be good for goodness' sake!"

Due to the great success of this clever campaign in attracting media attention, PhillyCOR has adopted the secular holiday sign concept for the 2008 winter season. Instead of a Tree of Knowledge, PhillyCOR will install a mini-billboard at the Free Speech Zone located at 6th and Market Streets in Philadelphia on the lawn adjacent to the National Constitution Center.

Those who support the Tree of Knowledge, never fear: The Freethought Society will also install a Tree of Knowledge for the second year in a row at the Chester County Courthouse.






2008 HumanLight/Winter Solstice Party!


Price: Tickets, which include the luncheon, are \$30/ adults, \$20/students. Under 18 are admitted free if accompanied by an adult.
